PACKERS FIGHT MD. SHELL LEVY

As a result of a conference Friday of State officials with V. Calvin Trice, counsel for the Tri-State Oyster Packers' Association, including membership in Maryland, Delaware, and Virginia, L. L. Leonard & Company, oyster packers of Cambridge, early next week will initiate a test case to determine the validity of a law enacted by the last Legislature requiring packers to give ten per cent. of their shells for planting purposes.

This action was agreed on by Mr. Trice, Robert H. Archer and Herbert Levy, assistant attorney-general, and H. H. Johnson, chief clerk of the conservation department.

The constitutionality of the measure was questioned at a recent meeting of the Packers' Association in Ocean City. Opposition was based on the assumption that the packing business would be rendered unprofitable through operation of the law.

The measure provides that packers shall apply to the Conservation Department for a license to pack oysters. The license cost is \$25. In order to obtain the license the packer must agree to give the State one-tenth of his shells or an equivalent in money. The shells would be used for planting in an effort to rehabilitate the oyster supply in Maryland waters.

Plans for a test case will enable packers in certain localities to begin operation about September 1 by taking out licenses with the proviso that they will abide by the final decision

in the test case. The right of the Conservation Department to issue the license was conceded by Mr. Trice. Persons packing oysters without first obtaining the license containing the proviso will be subject to prosecution because of the admitted constitutionality.

The Leonard Company, which is a member of the Tri-State Oyster Packers' Association, volunteered to make the test case. Mr. Trice said. Early next week the concern will apply to the Conservation Department for a license, asserting that it will not agree to give the State one-tenth of its shells. The license will be refused according to the plans.

A writ of mandamus to compel the Conservation Department to issue the license then will be sought in the Baltimore City Court and the State will file an answer to the petition. Whatever the decision of the lower court may be, an appeal will be taken to the Court of Appeals.

Final settlement of the case is expected early in October.


