ONLY 50 PERSONS HAVE ARTIFICIAL LARYNXES

In the three years since it was developed, only 50 persons in the entire country have been equipped with the Mackenty-Western Electric "artificial larynx," which will enable T. Coleman duPont, United States Senator from Delaware, to speak despite a major throat operation which has deprived him of vocal cords. The compact device is inherently expensive. For that matter, it can be "borrowed" from the Western Electric Company. Nevertheless, according to figures obtained from the company, the vast majority of persons who could regain speech by means of the apparatus either have not heard of it or for other reasons have failed to come forward.

It has been estimated there are living today in this country at least 600 persons who have successfully undergone the operation for cancer of the larynx. They breathe thru an opening in the neck thru which the windpipe has been surgically attached. All could talk again by means of the "artificial larynx," which requires only brief practice to master.

The device was perfected early in 1925 by Western Electric scientists, who worked in co-operation with Dr. John E. Mackenty, senior surgeon of the Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital. It was Dr. Mackenty who operated upon Senator duPont a little more than two weeks ago. Senator duPont is still at the hospital and his condition is reported "favorable."
