MORE POWER TO M. E. LAYMEN

A constitutional change giving laymen more voice in administrative affairs was approved at Kansas City Monday, at the Quadrennial General Conference of the M. E. Church.

By a vote of 713 to 45 the conference authorized the holding of lay conferences annually, in connection with the regular annual conferences.

The power of the annual conferences in ministerial matters would not be restricted, however.

Heretofore, laymen have had no voice at the annual conference and delegates said the M. E. Church was the only Protestant denomination that had not established lay representation throughout the entire administration.

The Rev. Harry E. Woolover was re-elected editor of the National Methodist Press, the church publicity bureau in Washington, D. C.

CHEVROLET ESTABLISHES A HIGH RECORD FIGURE

More than a half million new 1928 Chevrolets were on the road by the end of the fourth week in May, H. J. Klingler, General Sales Manager of the Chevrolet Motor Company, announced.

This establishes a record high figure for the public acceptance of a new model, since never before in the history of the industry has such a volume of new models been delivered in a similarly short space of time.

It also is more than 100,000 units in excess of the corresponding performance of the company in 1927, he said.

Phillips will receive the \$20-in-gold county prize, and also the Shore award, something other than cash, it has just been announced by George L. Radcliffe, Baltimore, chairman of the essays committee.

Winners of the \$20 prizes in other counties and the subjects of their sketches are: Kent county, Ethel M. Shirley, Rock Hall, on "Capt. Lambert Wickes;" Talbot, Florence Scullivan, Oxford, "The War of 1812 in Talbot;" Dorchester, Henrietta M. Jackson, Cambridge, "Gov. John Henry;" Queen Anne's, Dorothy Elizabeth Knotts, Sudlersville, "The Life of William Paer;" Worcester, Esther Johnson, Pocomoke City, "Stephen Decatur;" Caroline, Mary A. Lane, Ridgely, "Early Life in Carolina."

The contest, which was open to members of 1928 graduating classes dealt with the Revolutionary War ending with the end of the War of 1812, and with some person or event in the history of the county of the contestant. The awards were made in Baltimore on May 25.

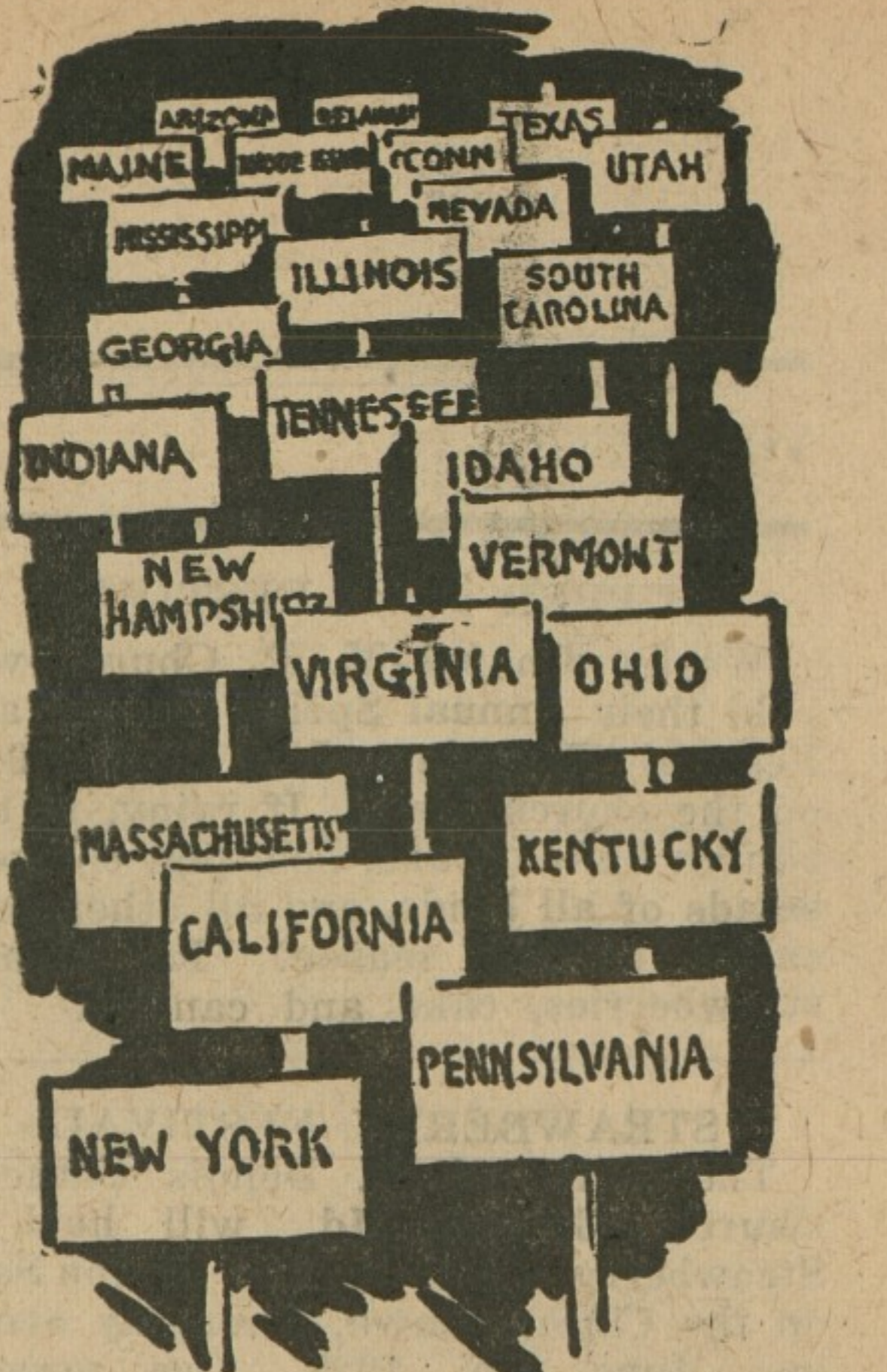
