DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE FOR THE HOUSE

In view of the fact that this is a presidential election year, and the campaigns of the candidates for the high office of chief Executive, generally overshadow all minor ones; and, in view of the fact that the selection of a Democratic Congressman from the First District, is an assured outcome—these two considerations might make voters somewhat indifferent to the candidacy of the Hon. T. Alan Goldsborough.

This indifference does not indicate any lack of real interest in Mr. Goldsborough's desire to succeed himself in the National House of Representatives. We believe that the voters have made up their minds to send him there, and if there is any unsettled mental condition, it is with reference to the difference between a Hoover Democrat and a Smith Democrat; a new controversy in the realms of political discussion.

And we further believed that any desertion from the ranks of Democracy, due to objections to Smith on the ground of his stand upon the prohibition question, or because of his church affiliation, will be all to the advantage of the other Democratic Candidates.

So far as Mr. Goldsborough is concerned, the primary election showed just how high he stood in the minds and hearts of the voters in the First District. In a time when there was no incentive in the way of local candidates to bring out a big vote, he carried every county on the Shore south of Kent, and by majorities much higher than were anticipated. The two counties, Kent and Cecil, which cast their vote against him, will fall in line, and thus Goldsborough's majority will be enlarged.

We believe him to be the best choice on the Shore for a Representative, and confidently look for a handsome majority in the November election.

LICENSE TAGS FOR 1929 TO BE WHITE AND GREEN

Thirty-nine States will change the color combination for automobile license plates in 1929 and 23 different motifs will be used. Maryland plates will be white on dark green.

There is a decided trend toward darker colors, it is revealed, and the "brunette" in license plates has gained a small lead over the "blonde." Although varied hues will be represented in the color schemes, nine states and the District of Columbia will retain last year's color combinations, reversing them as to background and lettering.

No single color motif can be said to prevail, although six states and the District of Columbia will use yellow letters and numerals on a black background.

This color scheme will therefore predominate in 1929, taking rank over the black on white motif, which was used in five states in 1928.

Second honor will go to orange on black combination, which will be used in five states, as compared to four last year. Four states will use a combination of white on black and the same number have adopted white on green.

Between and between will be found the color schemes of sister states, with Tulodian red an cream yellow, black on aluminum and a variety of other hues represented in the identification of the units in the nation's transportation system on rubber tires.

PROCLAMATION

Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of the State, 1928

WHEREAS, at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, held in the year 1927, an Act was passed to wit: Chapter 374 proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Maryland, title "Legislative Department" regarding the composition of the members of both Houses of the General Assembly of Maryland; in words and figures as follows:

CHAPTER 374
AN ACT to propose an amendment to Section 15 of Article III, of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative Department," regulating the compensation of the members of both Houses of the General Assembly of Maryland, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for adoption or rejection.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland (three-fifths of all the members of each of the two Houses concurring), That the following be and same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section 15 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative Department," the same if adopted by the legally qualified voters of the State of Maryland, to become Section 15 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Maryland.

Section 2. And he it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That said proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Maryland shall, at the next general election for Members of Congress held in this State, be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of the State for their adoption or rejection, in pursuance of the directions contained in Article XIV of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, and at the said general election the vote on the said proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment" as now provided by law, and immediately after said election due returns shall be made to the Governor of the State in accordance with said Article Fourteen.

Approved: April 5, 1927.

Now, Therefore, I, Albert C. Ritchie, Governor of the State of Maryland, in pursuance of the directions contained in Section 1 of Article 14 of the Constitution of Maryland, do hereby order and direct that this Proclamation containing a full, true and correct copy of the text of said Chapter 374 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1927, be published in at least two newspapers in each of the counties of the State where so many may be published and where not more than one may be published then in that newspaper, and in three newspapers published in the City of Baltimore, one of which shall be published in the German language, once a week for at least three months next preceding the general election to be held in the State of Maryland on Tuesday the 6th day of November, 1928, at which election the said proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be submitted to the Constitution in the legal and qualified voters of the State for adoption or rejection.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, this 14th day of July, in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

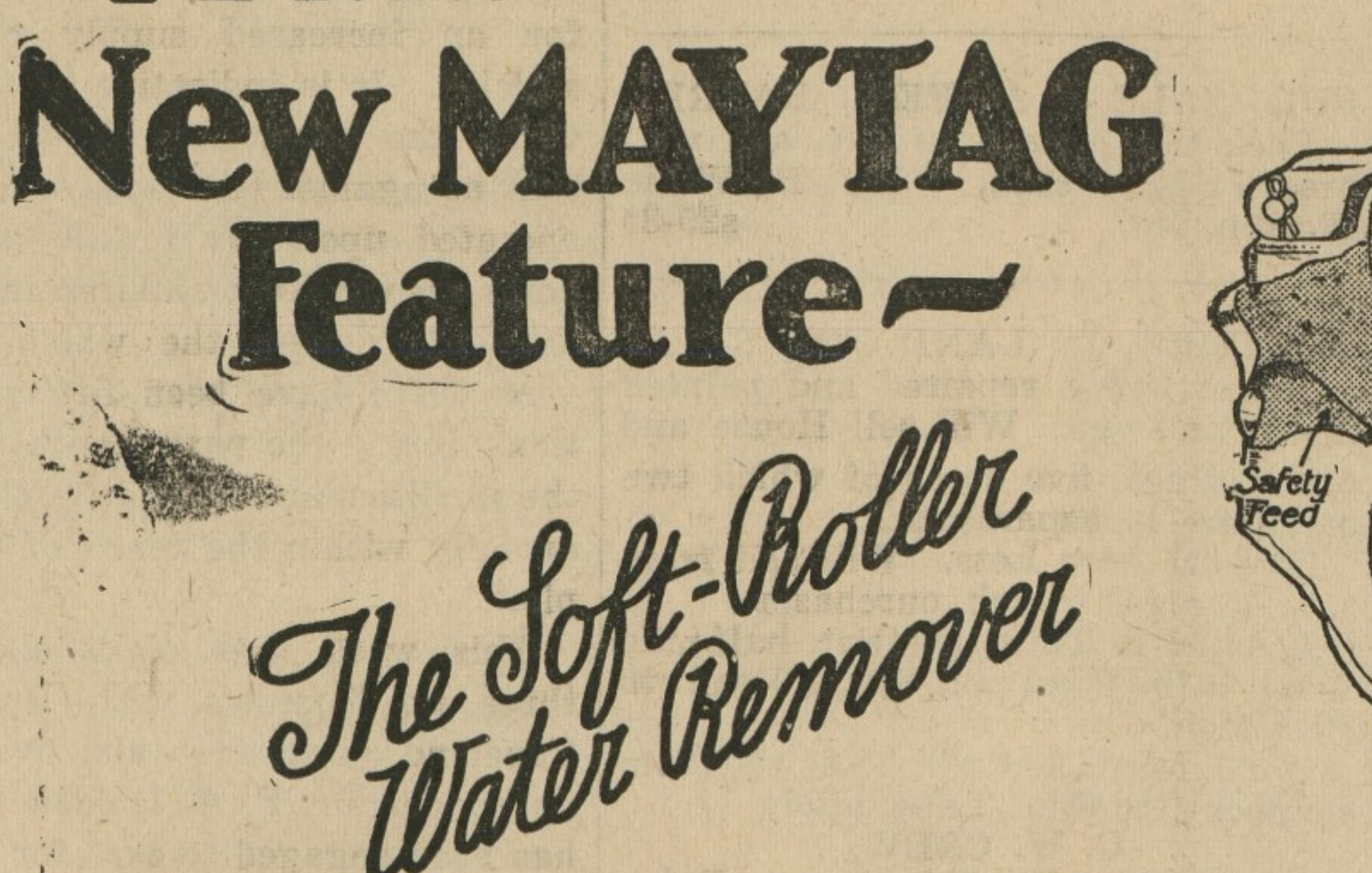

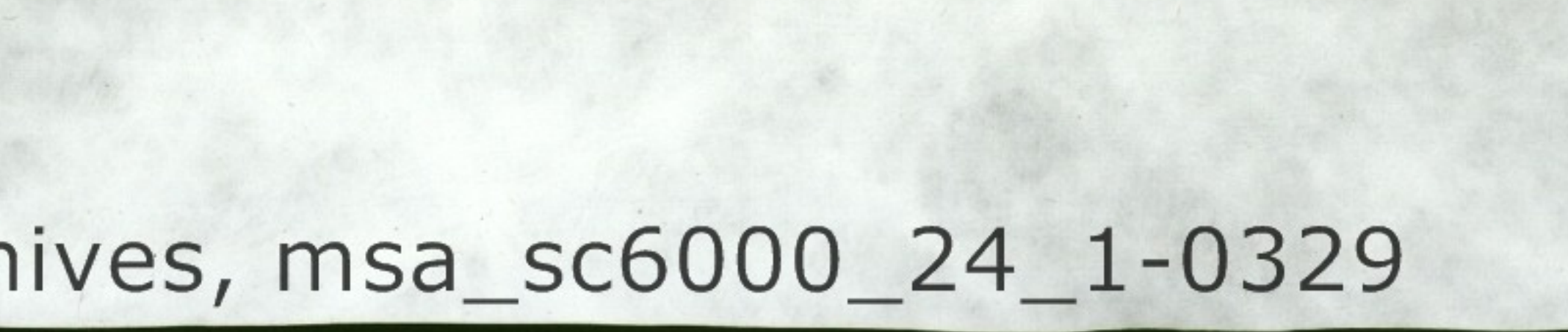

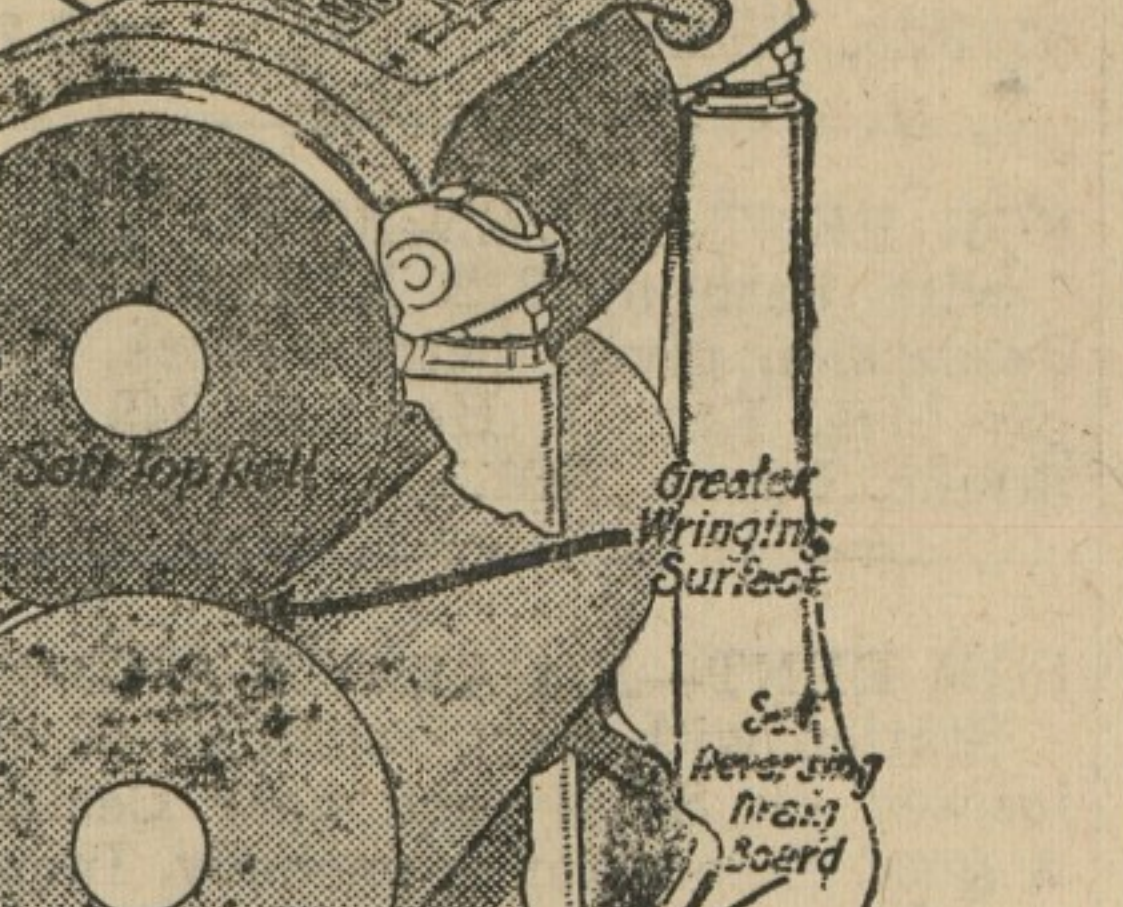
