BRITAIN DRYING UP!

The tendency of people to be more moderate in the use of liquor than in the days before the great war and prohibition is affecting Britain, with its license system, as well as nearly every other part of the civilized world.

In 1900 England consumed 32,000,000 gallons of spirits, last year only 10,000,000 gallons. In 1913 England used 30,000,000 barrels of beer; last year only 24,000,000 barrels. It is said that since the beginning of the war the number of total abstainers in Britain has increased from 2,000,000 to 10,000,000 and that here and there some communities have become wholly dry. But even now the annual drink bill of the country reaches the formidable figure of \$1,500,000,000.

The necessity of thrift in the period following the war may be a factitiousness of the people, although it is a view commonly held that poverty drives many to drink. The recognition by the public that automobile drivers cannot drink before a ride without imperiling their own lives and those of others has been an important factor. And many whose existence was so drab that they sought to enliven things by drinking liquor now content themselves with water.

Whatever the cause for the growing sobriety of Britain, the improvement in the drinking habits of her people adds to the strength of her nation.

SAYS MUSKRATS PLENTIFUL

Local trappers and marsh owners are looking forward to the opening of the trapping season which opens on January 1. Prospects look bright for a good season. Trappers claim that the season has allowed the reeds and cattails to grow abundantly on the marshes and as the muskrats feed from the roots of these it is believed that sufficient food is available for most young muskrats than for years.

Very few extremely high tides have covered the marshes this season and for this reason very few of the young rats have been drowned as is sometimes the case. Frequently the high tides which come on suddenly cover the houses before the old rats can take out their young.

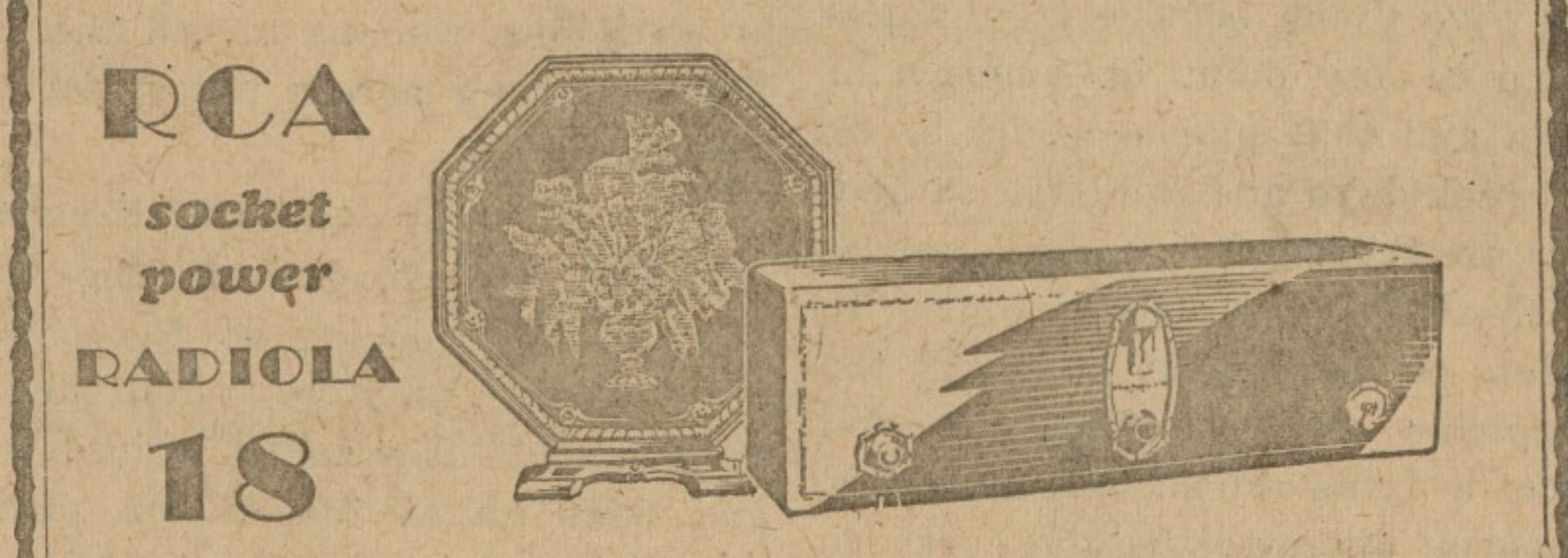

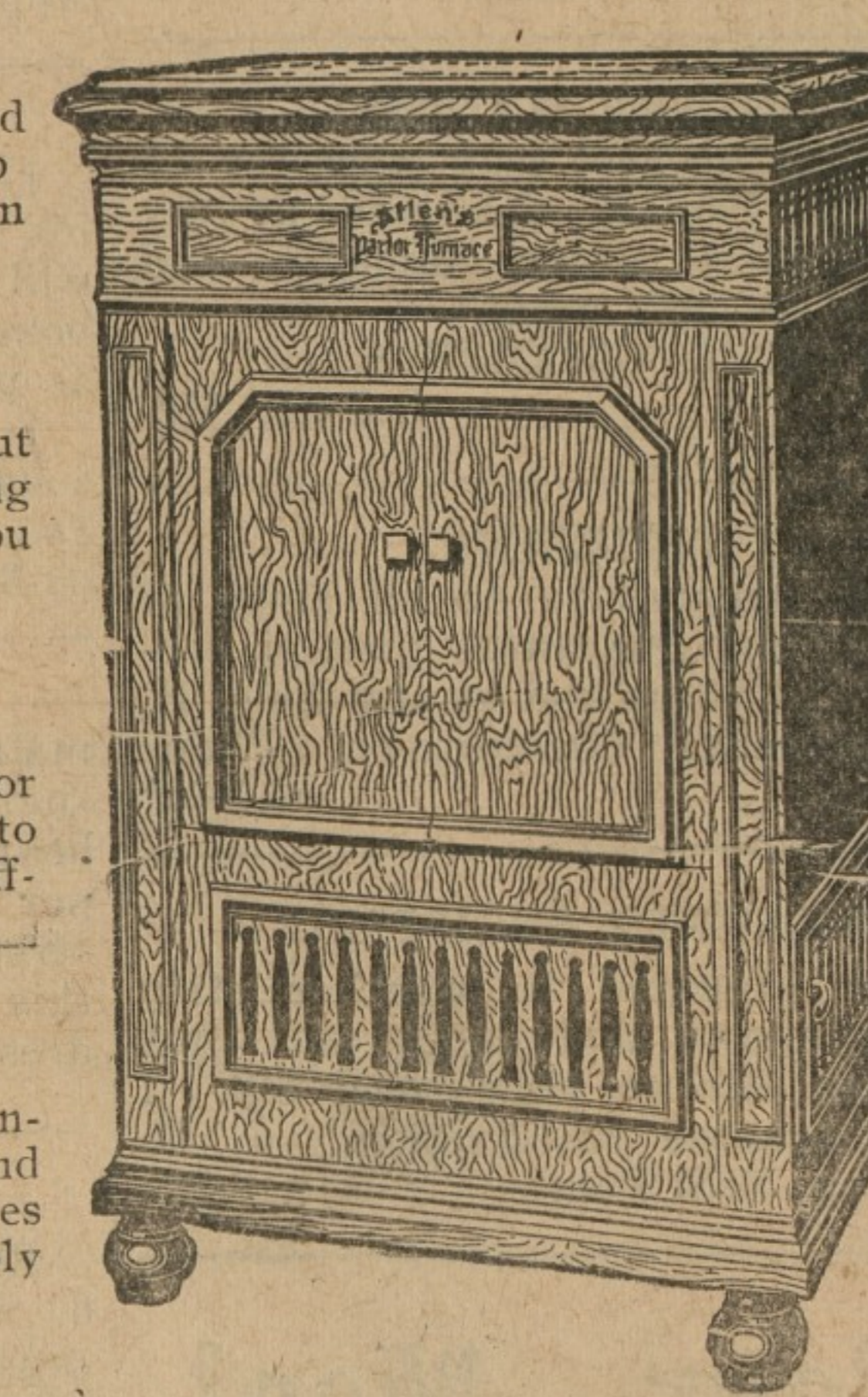
