ASKS STATE HELP BUILD SLAG ROAD

The entire membership of the Somerset County Board of County Commissioners, as well as members of the Boards of the nine counties on the Eastern Shore, except that of Queen Anne's, met with State Roads Commission in Baltimore on Monday.

The principal object of this meeting was to place before the Roads Commission a proposal for the construction of slag, or other hard-surfaced roads, instead of concrete. It is the contention of the Commissioners of the various Shore counties, and especially Somerset, that this type of road will more nearly meet the requirements of the public, and certainly a great deal more mileage could be secured for the same money, than under the present plan.

Under the new proposal it is claimed that at least eight miles could be constructed for the same cost.

The State Roads Commission expressed a desire to give the Counties what they want in the way of roads, but stated that the Federal Government would have to be sound before this proposal to substitute some cheaper material for concrete, could be carried out.

Canada's Memorial

The stinging tower of Ottawa is the Victory tower in the Parliament buildings, which represents Canada's memorial to her 53,000 sons who died in the World war. A carillon comprising 53 bells has been placed in a memorial chamber from where resigns are given. The largest bell weighs 22,400 pounds and is 100 inches in diameter. The weight of the smallest bell is 10 pounds and the diameter is 8 inches.

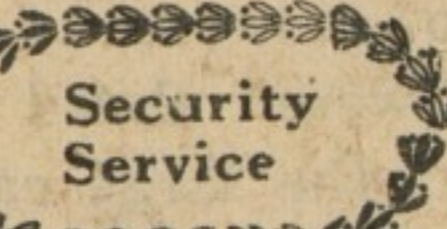
PURCHASE TRAVERS COTTAGE
