Four Good Habits

There are four good habits—punctuality, accuracy, steadiness, and despatch. Without the first of these time is wasted; without the second, mistakes the most hurtful to our own credit and interest, and that of others, may be committed; without the third nothing can be well done; and without the fourth opportunities of great advantage are lost, which it is impossible to recall.

Nature's Protection

The bureau of fisheries says that shrimps do not throw off a secretion which discolors the water, but that this fluid is discharged by the squids, which frequently travel in schools of shrimps. This discharge is a thin black fluid which occurs in sacs in the bodies of all octopods and is used as a protection to enable the animal to escape when being pursued.

SEVEN RULES FOR HEALTH

Dr. Royal S. Copeland, of New York, says in reference to winter colds that it behooves everyone to observe certain rules of health and right living. Then cold infections will be kept down to the minimum. To protect others every person who has a cold should be kept as much as possible away from others.

The Travelers' Insurance Society has made seven suggestions that should be exceedingly helpful in the avoidance of infection from colds. They recite, too, how to build up a resistance to colds.

- 1. Take regular exercise daily. This may be done by walking to and from work if the distance is reasonable. When this is impracticable simple setting-up exercises for a few minutes night and morning are beneficial. Spend as much time as possible out-of-doors. 2. Put in regular hours of sleep. This is important during epidemics of colds. Sleep restores spent energy and builds up body resistance. 3. Keep the feet dry. If they have become wet change to dry shoes and stockings at the earliest opportunity. A hot foot bath when the feet have been wet or chilled will often help to ward off a cold. 4. When colds are prevalent avoid as much as possible crowded public places. 5. Do not get the direct breath from persons having a cold—and they should protect you by covering the mouth with a handkerchief when they cough or sneeze. 6. Wash the hands frequently, use clean towels or other toilet articles. Avoid putting the fingers to the mouth or nose. 7. Keep the nose, mouth and throat clean. Brush the teeth at least twice a day. Gargle the throat, especially after having been to the theatre. Do it every night before retiring. Common table salt, a rounded teaspoonful to a pint of warm water, makes an excellent cleansing gargle. These are excellent rules to follow. If everyone would live up to them there would be a distinct drop in these devastating epidemics of colds. It is a pity that every Winter they sweep over places where many people gather together. Build up the body resistance to disease by eating simple, nourishing food; have plenty of sleep and rest; take daily exercise in the fresh air and sunshine. Then you are less likely to become ill when you are exposed to infection, and when ill your body resistance will better enable you to throw off the infection.

Shingles an Improvement

The homes of many of our ancestors in other lands had roofs of tile or thatch. When they came to these shores they found no tiles awaiting them. They made shingles. As it turned out, they were better off without tiles or thatched roofs, because the shingles were warmer in winter and cooler in summer. Shingles have been popular in this country for more than 300 years.

CATTLE THIEVES

Three Southerners, Clifford Tedder of North Carolina, and Albert Pruitt and his son, William Pruitt, formerly of Alabama, are being held in Harford county jail at Belair, charged with participation in several cattle stealing escapades. They are alleged to have confessed the theft of several animals in that county.

A few nights ago, thieves visited the Blevine property near Backs, and loaded a heifer. They proceeded to Joseph Harkins' farm and were said to have been in the act of dragging a second calf towards their truck when a passing motorist became suspicious and backed his machine up. As the motorist stopped the thieves became alarmed, tossed the calf out and dashed off in their truck, leaving a portion of their truck rack on the bank.

These facts were communicated to officers, who visited the Pruitt home. There they found a truck, minus a portion of the rack. Acting on the information in hand, Deputy Sheriff Bowman visited an adjacent tomato field and arrested Pruitt, his son, William and Tedder.

All of the men at first denied being implicated in the thefts but they are later alleged to have told the whole story.
