STATE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY MEETS JULY 23RD

The annual summer meeting of the Maryland State Horticultural Society is to be held on Wednesday, July 23, 1930, at New Windsor. Mt. Olivet orchards and New Windsor orchards will be toured. Orchard tillage tools will be demonstrated. Fruit grading, washing and polishing machinery will be in operation. United States grades and standards will be discussed, as will the Federal Farm Board's plans for marketing fruits and vegetables. Lunch on Blue Ridge College campus. In the event of rain the program will be staged indoors. All interested people are invited to attend. Details will be in hands of County Agent soon.

NEW TARIFF IS A BAD LAW

A "NOBLE EXPERIMENT" IN WHICH SHORE FARMERS WILL BE "RELIEVED"—AND NOW.

President Hoover, in signing the Tariff Bill this week, has dealt a solar-plexus blow to the farming element of Kent and other Eastern Shore counties and incidentally to the general welfare and prosperity of the area as well.

The Baltimore Sun of Wednesday, under an editorial captioned "For the Files," seems very ably to sum up the situation:

"Fourteen months ago President Hoover called upon Congress to make 'limited changes' in the tariff to aid agriculture and a few industries suffering from 'insuperable' foreign competition. Yesterday there was presented for his signature a general upward revision which boosts the American tariff wall (about 18 per cent.) to the highest point in all history, which promises to add greatly to the financial burdens of the farming population, and which grants added protection to many industries whose 'insuperable' foreign competition comes from imports constituting fractions of one per cent. of the domestic production.

"Could it be that Mr. Hoover, the economist, much of whose strength in the White House was presumed to lie in his capacity to formulate and carry out sound economic policies, attached his signature to such a complete repudiation of his prescription of a sensible tariff revision? Alas, it not only could, but was. And thus ends (or is begins) another noble experiment."

New Company Was Denied A Franchise

Counsel for two rival ferry companies appeared in the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's county in Centerville in a mandamus hearing before Judges William H. Adkins and Lewin W. Wickes. The hearing was an outgrowth of proceedings instituted several weeks ago by the Bay Bridge Ferry Corporation to require the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's county to show cause why they should not grant a franchise to the corporation similar to that given the Claiborne-Annapolis Ferry Company, after the Commissioners had denied a franchise.

At the conclusion of the hearing, Chief Judge Adkins announced he would be engaged all this week on the Court of Appeals bench, but that immediately thereafter he would be ready to go into the case.

Richard F. Cleveland, Baltimore, and Edwin H. Brown, Jr., Centerville, were counsel for the Bay Bridge Ferry Corporation; William Mason Shehan, and G. Elbert Marshall, for the Claiborne-Annapolis Ferry Company, and J. H. C. Legg, Centerville, represented the Queen Anne's County Commissioners.

Last year the Claiborne-Annapolis Company obtained an exclusive franchise from the County Commissioners to establish, operate and maintain a ferry between Matapeake, on Kent Island, and Annapolis.

The commissioners assert this franchise was given because of the operation accorded by the Claiborne-Annapolis interests in obtaining the \$500,000 Eastern Shore Boulevard, extending through Queen Anne's county from the bay to Queen Anne and which is now nearing completion.

The Claiborne Company is spending \$200,000 on its Kent Island terminal and will be ready to give service July 1st.

The Bay Bridge Ferry Company based its argument on an old law passed during the Revolutionary war period which provided for row boat ferries. The case was ably argued.

WHEAT GRADING LABORATORY FOR EASTER SHORE

Last summer a wheat grading laboratory was conducted at Easton for the benefit of Eastern Shore farmers and buyers. Many people made use of the inspectors. The laboratory is to be continued again this season. Co-operation between Federal and State Forces makes possible this service. The laboratory will be open July 1st. Details are not yet announced, but it is thought they will be similar to last year's arrangements. A small charge for the inspection and grading is made. Complete details will be in the hands of the County Agent before July 1st.

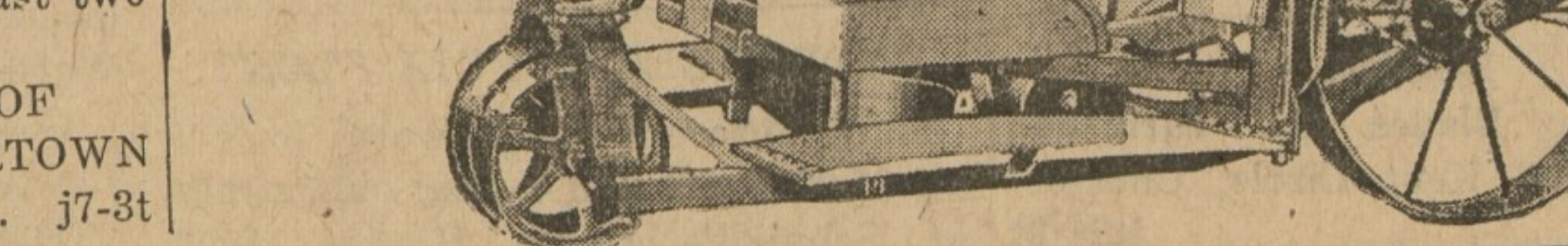
