"Texas, the largest State," Mr. Garner declares, "has an area or 265,293 square miles, and is approx imately 70 per cent larger than its nearest competitor. If the State were divided equally into five States each would have an area of 53,175 square miles, or approximately the same as Arkansas. Twenty-three the States have areas less than 53,-.000 square miles."




