Are You Raising Your Own Crop?

When you get irritated at the flying insect that annoys you when you sit on your porch, or that get into your sleeping quarters and keep you awake with their buzzing and stinging...

"The best way to get rid of mosquitoes, is to get rid of their breeding places. Every empty tin can that has accumulated an inch or so of water, and that has been left on the rubbish heap is a potential place Mosquitoes breed in stagnant water...

"Some mosquitoes are long lived but average life of most of them is about two weeks, so there is hope of relief if the breeding places are gotten rid of. Community action is necessary for mass effort—for such measures as draining swamp, oiling streams, or stocking ponds and streams with the minnows that eat the mosquito larvae...

"The county health officers and the representatives of the Bureau of Sanitary Engineering when making sanitary inspections of the recreation and tourist camps throughout the State, are often asked to locate the source of the 'clouds of mosquitoes' that appear from time to time to the great discomfort of the campers...

"Mosquitoes are able to fly about half a mile from their breeding places, under their own power, but high winds will carry them much farther. Trains, boats and automobiles, also furnish free transportation for them. Accordingly, householders, campers and wayside picnickers will be performing a public service and will add greatly to the comfort of their neighbors, far and near by disposing of their discarded jars, tin cans and other water-holding receptacles in such a way that they do not serve as breeding places for these winged pests."

THE State Roads Commission of Maryland has decided to build three new bridges in Cecil county, costing in the neighborhood of \$384,000. One will be at Porters' Bridge, costing about \$50,000; another at Elkton, over Big Elk Creek, costing about \$24,000, and the third one will be across the Bohemia river, nine miles south of Elkton.

The Bohemia river structure will cost about \$310,000, and will replace the present dilapidated wooden structure, built more than a half century ago. Repeated efforts have been made to get a new bridge over the Bohemia, and on two previous occasions in 1914 and again in 1918, the Legislature appropriated money for a new bridge there, but for some reasons, never made public, the money was spent elsewhere.

The new bridge will be more than a quarter of a mile in length.
