Were it not for the State Aid Funds operation of the Kent County public schools) which approximate one-half the amount of the county levy for school purposes, the county school tax rate would have to be increased 30 or 35 cents on each \$100 of asessable property in order to main. tain the Kent County schools on the basis of present day standards.

The policy of the State regarding the qualifications of teachers is based on the following principles: (1) The teacher is the most important factor in the training of children in school. (2) The better trained the teacher is for his work, the better education he can help his pupils to acquire.
