Walter L. Main Circus Now On 48th Annual Tour Regarded As A National Institution

With only a few more days remaining before the appearance of the Walter L. Main Circus here considerable interest is being manifested, not only by the younger generation, but also by many of the older "boys."



On its 48th tour of the United States is regarded as a national institution. Year after year the big show comes for its annual visit.

The Walter L. Main circus, which comes to Chestertown on Sept. 19, affords a complete program of the newest and most novel circus features available today.

Among the features this season are flying aerialists, a sextette of dancers who cavort gracefully on a lofty wire.

Foremost among the equestrians to

be seen with the big show this season is the Cottrill-Powell Family, with their tango horses from the London Hippodrome; Miss Bessie Hollis, a new comer in circus ranks who looks more the part of a debutante than a somersault rider, and who is the

product of one of the most fashionable girls' finishing schools; Capt. Raymond DeVry, who comes from the Crystal Palace Theatre, Budapest, with a novel tandem act; Mlle. Doree, with her stable of high school horses, recently a feature of the Folies Bergere, Paris, France, and well known but whose names cannot be mentioned here for lack of space.

A spectacular street parade will be seen on the downtown streets at 11 a. m., preceding the first exhibition. Doors to the big show open at 1 and 7 p. m., and the performances start promptly at 2 and 8 p. m.

Few local players, for this reason, enter the tournament and therefore tennis is dying out on the peninsula. It is the hope of the local club to revive some of the former interest in the court sport by giving the young players on the peninsula something to strive toward.

It is the plan of the local club to have both single and double matches in the tournament next season. Silver loving cups will be given the winners.

Johnston Has Fair Season

The batting records of the Eastern Shore League for the 1927 season reveal the following about Bill Johnston, Kent County boy, who has managed Cambridge this season: Bill finished the season with a batting average of .259. He appeared in 73 games and was at bat 275 times, making 39 runs and 71 hits, for a total of 92 bases. His hits included 9 doubles, 1 triple and four home runs. Johnston made 118 put outs, 18 assists and was scored perfect, or 1,000 in fielding, having been errorless throughout the season.

Jake Flowers, former Chestertown and Washington College base ball star, after several weeks lay off again appeared in the Brooklyn National line-up last week.

On one occasion Flowers played second base and gathered himself a hit and run.

Again he was used as a pinch hitter but failed to connect. Flowers has been kept idle for the greater part of the season because of a recurring injury to the index finger upon his throwing hand. A piece of bone was removed from the end of the finger two years ago. It is thought that it may be necessary to remove the whole finger and if such is done the base ball future of the Eastern Shore boy is doubtful.
