Third: President Coolidge is a poor man. President Coolidge has made a profound impression upon the big business men of the country and big business corporations. It is commonly understood that a billion dollar corporation would tender the presidency of this corporation to Mr. Coolidge. The salary for such position would be around one-half million dollars a
