Jack Delaney, the light-heavyweight champion, was one of several hundred onlookers as the Boston fighter skipped through his paces, and although he would not commit himself, Delaney did say that Sharkey appeared to be ready right now for the heavyweight elimination fight with Jack Dempsey, scheduled July 21.

Sharkey devoted his boxing sessions today to straightening out his punches. After punching the bag for about 10 minutes he boxed a round with Paul Cavalier. The Sharkey interpretation of the right uppercut went pretty hard with Cavalier, but Paul stood up and took his beating manfully.

Sharkey was perspiring fast when he quit for the day, but his wind was fine and he was not in the least tired.

Johnny Buckley, Sharkey's manager, says that Jack will continue his road work right up to the time of the fight, but that the sparring sessions will be lightened several days before.

Several weeks ago the two teams again hooked up in a bargain bill at Wilmington and the Silverbrook nine won both ends.

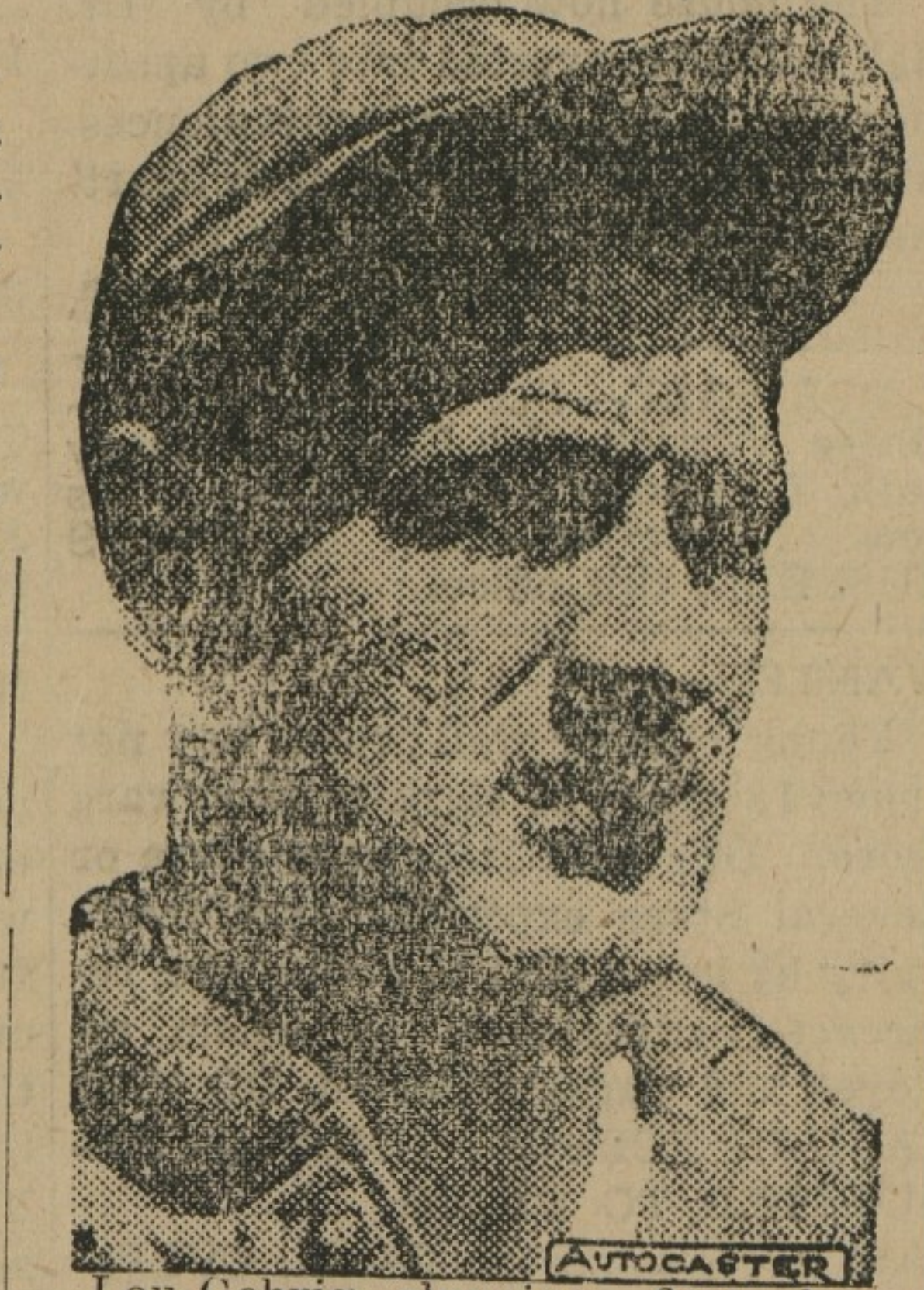
