MORE DIRTY STREETS

might be traced the reason for much of his success. Men who expect good results, not bad, are much more likely to see their efforts succeed.

Franklin had ample reason to be discouraged. The provoking acts of the British kept the American colonies in a turmoil and Franklin was always in the front ranks, fighting the cause of the people.

He was great because he served others. He lived not for himself alone, but seemed obsessed with the idea of bettering the conditions of the people.

And he served well because he had an optimistic viewpoint. He could be serious on occasion, but only when it was absolutely required.

Secretary Mellon corrected some of the misunderstandings held by the professors, and that likewise seems to persist in the minds of many others who have joined in a revival of the movement for "cancellation."

Among other things, the secretary of the treasurer reminded the learned men of the east that the debts which America would collect were not all incurred during the heat of battle; that while the allies were getting supplies here on credit, we were buying abroad and paying cash.

The professors lamented the "tremendous burden of taxation for the next two generations on friendly countries." Mr. Mellon called their attention to the fact that all of four principal debtors are receiving from Germany more than enough to pay their debts to the United States.

He also might have reminded the complainers that the money burnt up in the war has to be paid, if not by those who burnt it, then by the people of the United States, who were "innocent bystanders."

We might have more patience with these debt-cancellation advocates if they would view this question from the standpoint of Americans. Have they not thought that cancelling the debts would in the same way place a "tremendous burden of taxation" for the next two generations on Americans?
