## Pentagon Faces Hardest Game Friday Night

### Will Visit Manhattan College In New York For The First Game After Holidays

Manhattan College, of New York, looms up as the main obstacle in the path of a Washington College defeatless season. In the opinion of many followers of the local five, Washington will face its most formidable foe on Friday night when they toss at the New York school's goals.

This game was originally one of a trio that the "Flying Pentagons" was to play on a northern trip. Two of the games fell through at the last moment, leaving only Manhattan as an opponent on the northern jaunt.

For the past several years, Manhattan has occupied practically the same position in the north as Washington College has in the region. A small school with a real basketball club. Last year they defeated Columbia, winners of the Intercollegiate League title last season.

The most notable feat of the Manhattan five this year has been the trimming of Dartmouth 23 to 19. The fact that Dartmouth walloped Army by a lopsided score make the Manhattan victory indeed noteworthy.

Mike Hayes and Neil Cohalan, stars of the Manhattan team, are products of Waterbury, Connecticut basketball. They are well known to some of the local team and the "Pentagon" realizes the tough proposition that awaits them in New York on Friday night.

Coach Kibler is busy with the Washington team this week in an endeavor to get them back into the before-the-holiday form. He is working the team afternoon and night.

The lineup of the Washington five against Manhattan will probably be as in the previous games this season. Captain Carroll and Giriatis, forwards; Seib, center; Dumschott and Cavanaugh, guards.

### America Makes Her Own Prosperity

It should be remembered that the cause of prosperity in a country is not only its ability to produce, but its ability to consume.

America is prosperous not only because its labor is efficient, it has great skill, and produces a large quantity of goods, but also because it contains a very large proportion of people who want a great many things.

The superiority of America over Europe is not only caused by the fecundity of the American workman but also by the supremacy of American wants.

Recent figures show that real wages in the United States, that is, wages in terms of food, clothes and rent says George W. Hinman, are double the real wages in Great Britain and three of four times the real wages on the continent of Europe. This is due not only to our enormous supplies, but equally due to our enormous demand. In the prosperity of a country must be taken into account its ability to manufacture and transport, but equally important is its ability to consume.

The advertisements in the newspapers are constantly creating new desires among our people. They are stimulating the want for more and better things and thus creating an enormous market for our products. Thus there is direct connection between the superior newspapers of the United States and its superior prosperity.

Whatever induces a people to want more and better goods is valuable, as well as whatever stimulates them to produce more and better goods.

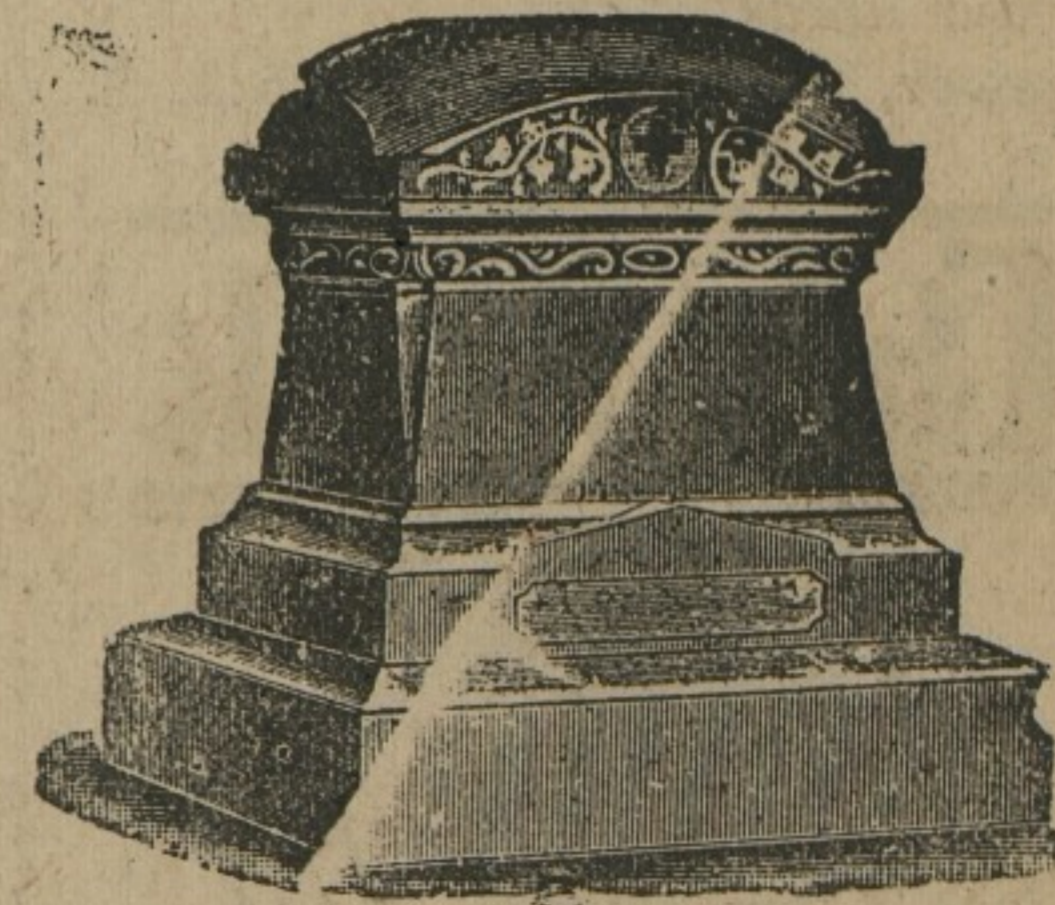
