Total \$100,000.00 Section 5. And he it eracted that R. Hynson Rogers, Thos. G. Wroth. James H. Sides and L. Bates Russell are hereby created and constituted a special commission with equal authority, to act and co-operate with the commissioners of Chestertown in the use and expenditures of the fund received from said bond issues. And the Commissioners of Chestertown and the Special Commission, acting as one body are hereby authorized to fill any vacancy in said Special Commission.

Section 6. And he it enacted. That at the next regular election for Commissioners of Chestertown there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of Chestertown, the question whether honds shall be issued for "Chestertown Curb and Gutter, Roadway, Pavement, Sower Liquidation of Debt Fund," and at such election the hallots cast upon that question shall have the words "For Chestertown Curb and Gutter, Roadway, Pavement, Sewer, Liquidation of Deht Bonds," or "Against Chestertown Curb and Gutter, Roadway, Pavement, Sewer, Liquidation of Debt Bands," thereon and if the majority of the votes cast upon said question shall be " For Chestertown Curb, Gutter, Roadmay, Sidowalk, Sewer and Liquidation of Debt Bonds," then the Commissioners of Chastertown and the Special Committee or a majority of them, shall proceed to execute the power vested in them by this act, but if the majority of the votes cast shall be "Against Chestertown Curb and Gutter. Roadway. Pavement, Sewer, Liquidation of Debt

Bonds," then this act shall be of no effect. Section 7. And be it enected, that this Act is an emergency law and necessary for the preservation of the public health and safety and having been passed by a yea or may vote supported by three-fifths of all the members of each of the two Houses elected to the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.
