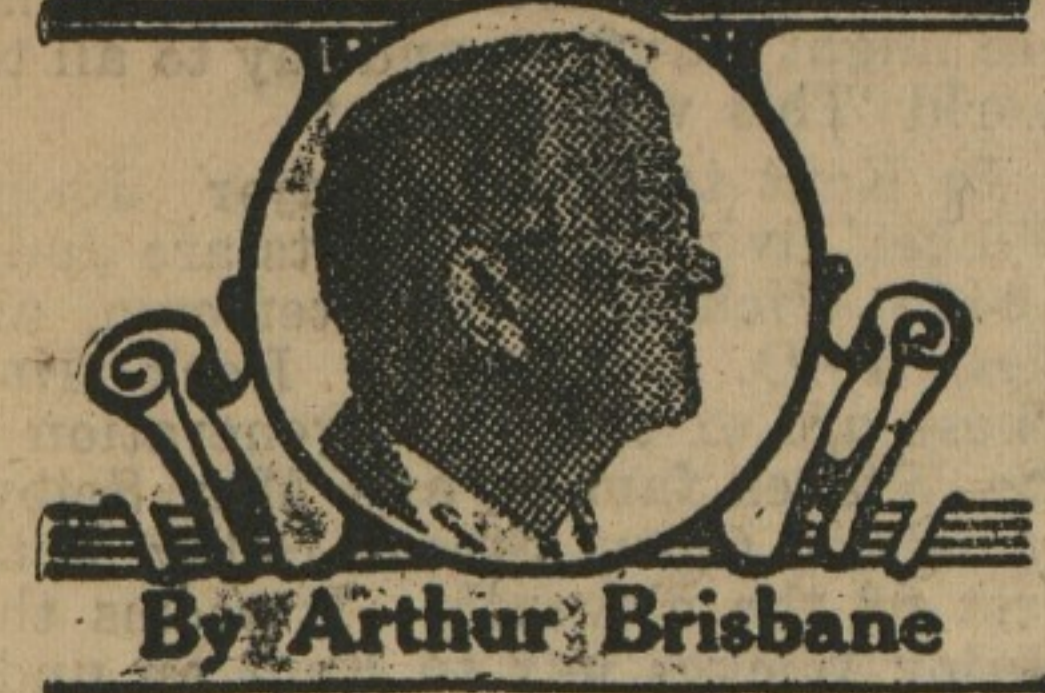

A dinner was held at the Voshell House on April 8th for all the members of the Chamber of Commerce.

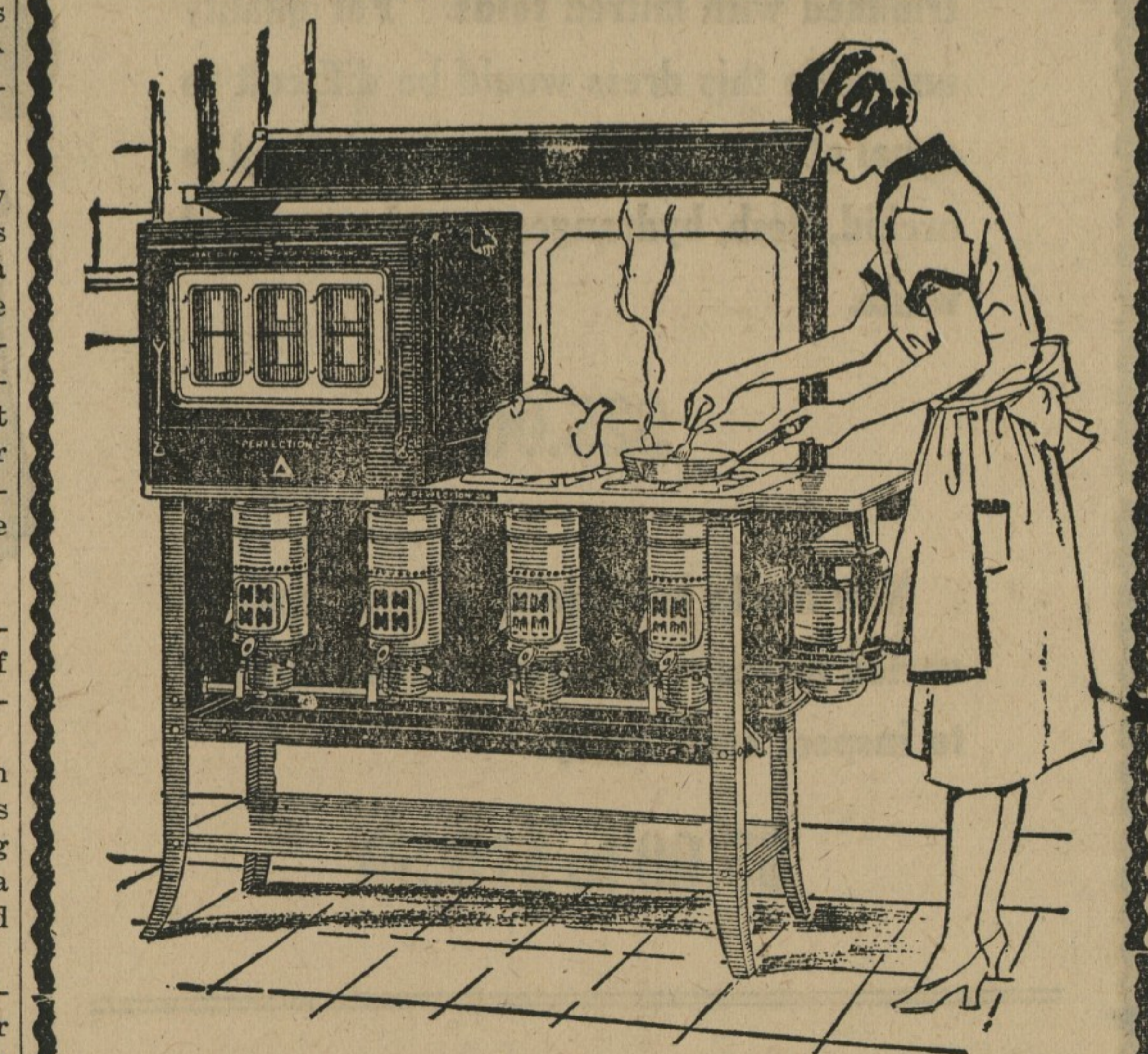
The Baltimore American has been featuring the various counties of the Peninsula, depending upon each county to furnish pictures and data.

West Virginia Girl Now Leads By Nine Days In School Contest

Miss Letha Ezma Ferguson, of Wayne, W. Va., has jumped into first place in the national school contest with a record of twelve years, nine days perfect school attendance.

This betters only by nine days the record held by Miss Mabel Seal of Pigeon, Miss, Miss Lillian E. Snyder of Hundred, W. Va., and George Irvin of Orrville, Ohio, who were tied, and in the lead for several weeks with a record of twelve years.

Miss Ferguson entered her thirteenth school year with a perfect record when school opened September 13, 1926. She maintained that perfect record until the 24th day of September, nine days after school started, making her record twelve years and nine days.

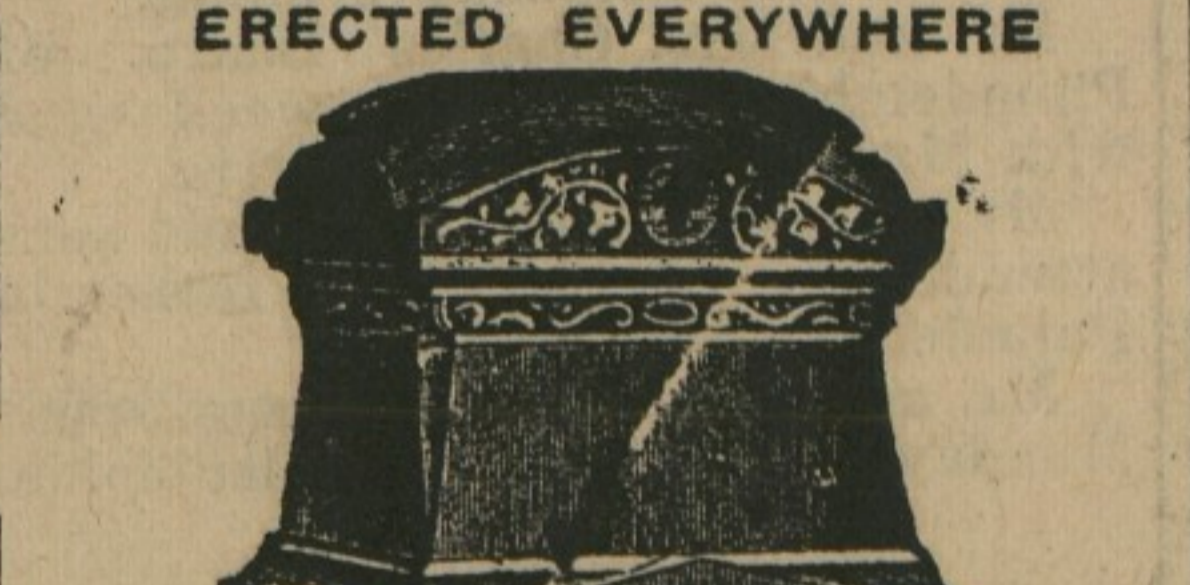
