**THE AVERAGE FARMER. KNOW YOURSELF. ADD 10 YRS. AN EXPENSIVE SPANKING. O. H. KAHN, WISE FATHER.**

How would you like to be the average American farmer? His farm is 315 acres. His investment \$16,308. His average net return for 1926 was \$1,133.

He could make more than that driving a street car, getting regular sleep, not worrying about weather, lame horses, sick cows, rust on wheat bugs on potatoes, blight in the orchards, etc.

The puzzling question is why is a farmer?

More important to millions of Americans, cotton has gone to a new high price for this year, three times on three consecutive days.

When cotton, not long ago, sold at half today's price, this writer said to Mr. Clarence Dillon, ingenious New York financier: "Buy yourself plenty of cotton and you will make a great deal of money."

## ALFALFA

ASK ME ANOTHER

By County Agent, H. B. DERRICK WHY YOU SHOULD RAISE ALFALFA

1. Alfalfa hay solves the problem of economic dairy feeding. Cheaper milk production is as profitable as receiving higher prices for milk.
2. Alfalfa yields 50 to 100 per cent more hay per acre and the hay is 30 per cent richer in protein than clover. It is the coming hay crop for the dairy farmers of Kent County.
3. Alfalfa should give three crops per year for at least three years; clover gives one, or possibly two, per year. Timothy has very little place on a dairy farm.
4. Alfalfa can be substituted for part of the grain ration. Many mixed feeds consist largely of ground alfalfa. Ton for ton alfalfa is nearly equal to bran.
5. Alfalfa hay, corn silage and corn meal, all home grown, have proved successful as a balanced dairy ration.
6. Alfalfa pasture is highly desirable for chickens. The hay is excellent for horses if fed in moderation.
7. Alfalfa, being a legume, secures a large part of its nitrogen from the air. It improves the soil for subsequent crops.
8. Alfalfa is not difficult to raise, the few essentials to its success are easily provided.
9. Alfalfa hay is nearly always in demand at a good price. It is a good cash crop.
10. If wheat does not pay, raise Alfalfa Hay.
