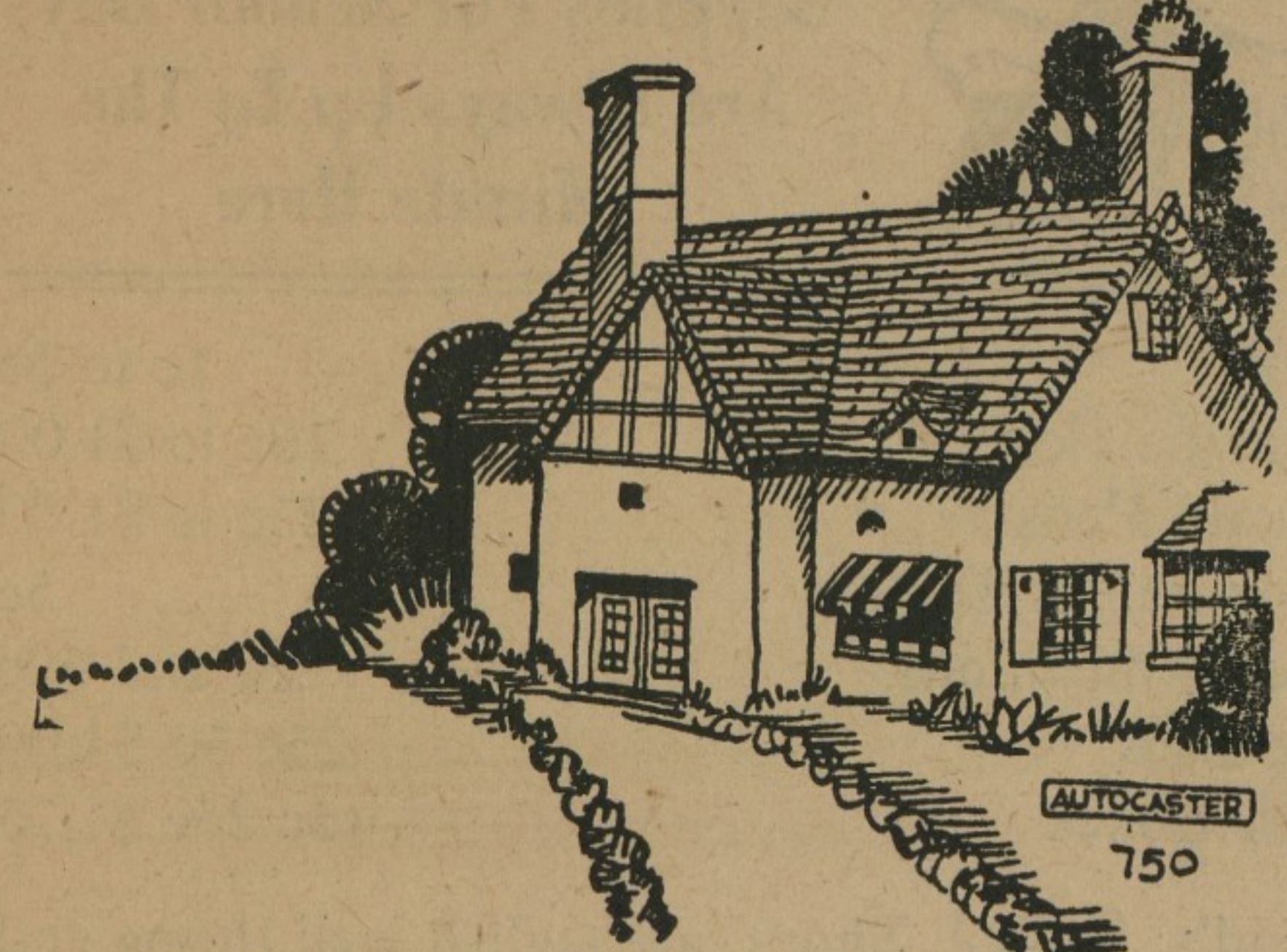

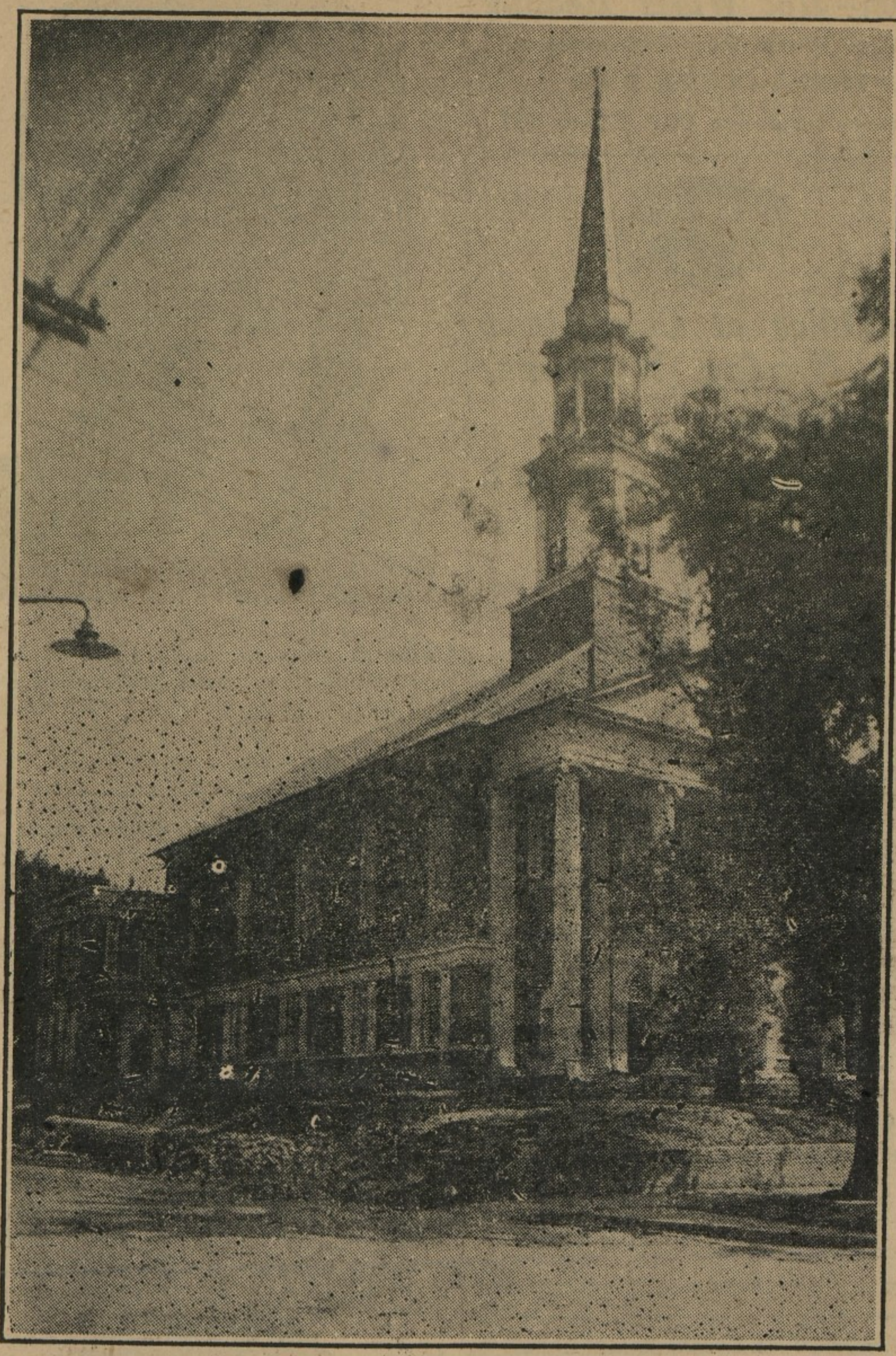

Methodist preachers came into this section very early in the progress of Methodism in this country. Kent circuit was one of the very early appointments and Chestertown was the head of the circuit.

The first Methodist church was built about the year 1799. That building still stands near the front of the Voshell House attesting the permanence of the Methodist movement in the minds of the builders.

For the past ten years there has been a growing conviction and bids a station, that is, a due church appointment in the year 1875.

The present splendid location was donated to the Board of Trustees by John N. Usilton, for many years a prominent Methodist of the town.
