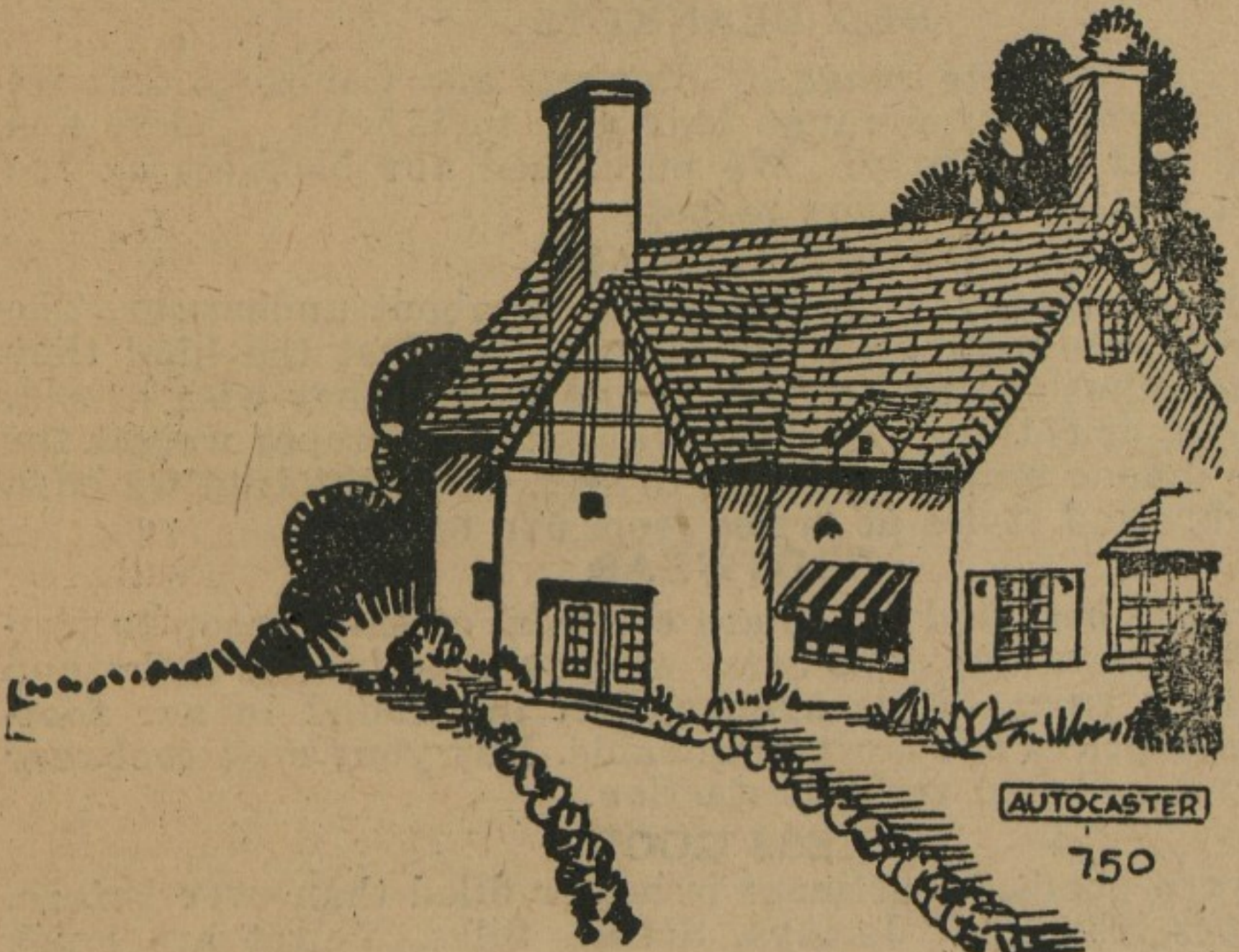

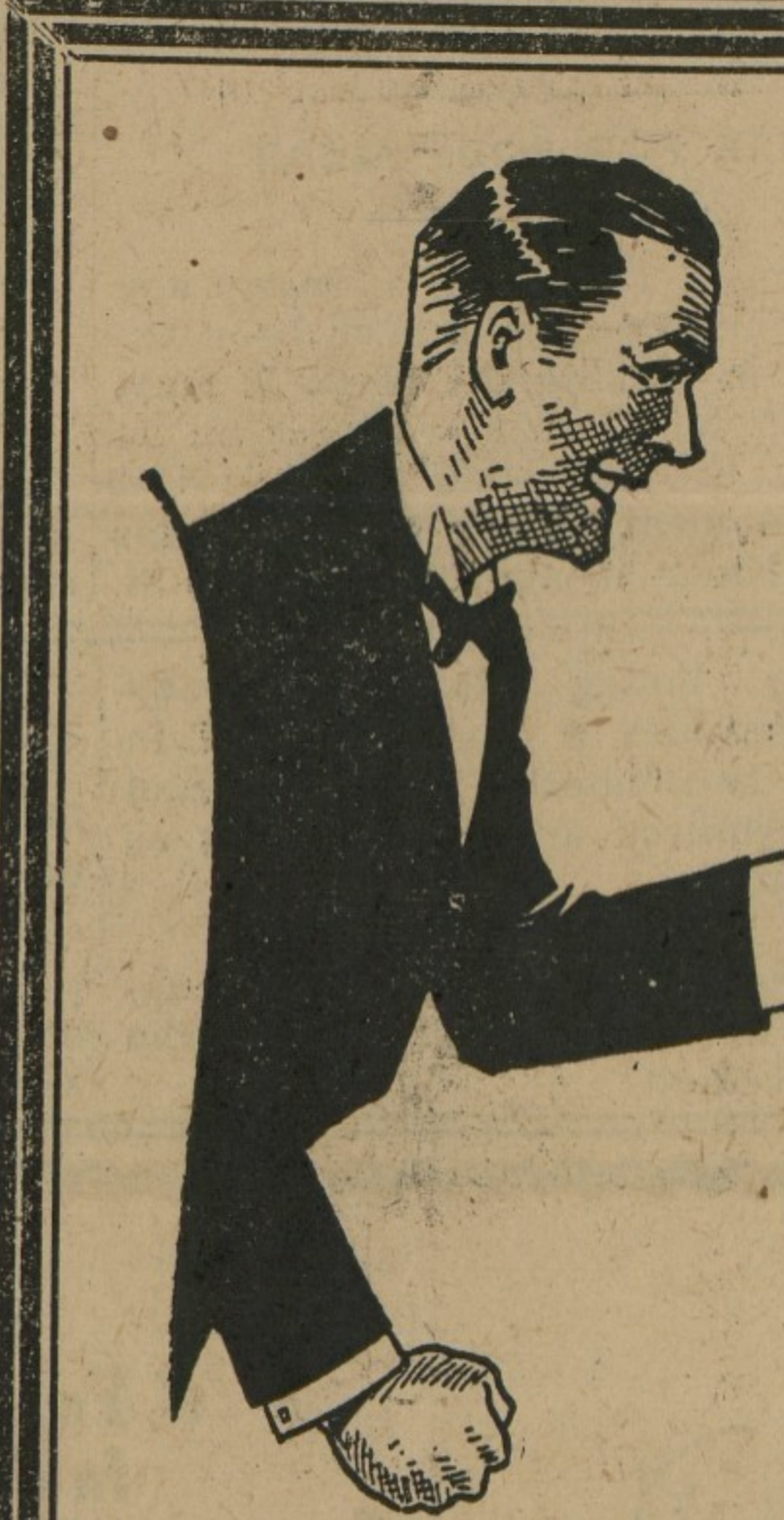
Table with 2 columns: School Name, Percent of attendance of the schools of Kent County for September, 1927.
