Many Attended Turkey Meet Last Wednesday
Between 500 and 600 people from all sections of Maryland, a number from Delaware, and a former resident of Ontario, Canada, attended the Thanksgiving turkey field meeting held on the Baker turkey ranch on Wednesday afternoon, the most interesting feature of which aside from addresses by state and county officials was the feeding and inspection of the mammoth flock of 1000 turkeys being prepared for market. It was announced at the meeting that Mrs. Baker sold 100 birds to Pennsylvania breeders on Thursday for which she received \$2,000 and during the meeting on Wednesday she refused an offer of \$100 for a fine turkey hen. Mrs. Baker expects to net between \$10,000 and \$12,000 from the flock this year, and Dr. Thomas B. Symons, director of the State Extension Service, who was present, states that the ranch is the greatest thing of its kind in the state and is an evidence of what concentration of purpose and devotion to work will accomplish for the development of the poultry industry in the country.
