

The Treasurer wishes to call atten-1918, providing for the collection of State Taxes.

This Act provides that State Taxes are due the first of July in the year in which they are levied, and if not paid by the first day of October in said year, interest of one half of one per cent shall be charged, if paid at any time during the month of October and interest of one half of one per cent shall be charged for each additional month or fraction thereof that such taxes remain unpaid. Said State Taxes shall be in arrears on and after the first day of January succeeding the date of Levy, AND IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF SAID COLLECTORS, TREASURERS, AND OTHER OFFICERS WHO MAY BE CHARGED WITH THE COLLEC-TION OF SAME IMMEDIATELY THEREAFTER TO PROCEED TO COLLECT SAID TAXES IN AR-REAS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISION OF THE LAW leans, who returned to the United FOR THE COLLECTION OF DE-LINQUENT TAXES.
