CYCLE RACING FOR CAMBRIDGE.

Program for the Fourth of July Meet Completed.

meet of the Maryland Division League of American Wheelmen, to be held July 3 and 4, has been arranged, as a result of the trip to Cambridge, where the meet will be held, by Chief Consul Conway W. Sams and Mr. Albert Mott. The program of events will be as follows: On the first day (July 3) there will be: Onemile novice (medal), pacemakers' prize: one-mile professional handicap, three prizes; half mile division championship (medal), pace-makers' prize; one-third mile professional dash, three prizes; one-mile division cham-pionship (medal), pacemakers, prize; two-mile professional handicap, three prizes; one. handicap (amateur), three prizes; two-third mile professional consolation, two prizes;

pacemakers' prize; one-mile time trials (amateur), flying start, paced, to establish track record, winner to have prize value, at least two starters to make the trial. On the second day (July 4) the list of events will be: One-mile novice (medal), pacemakers prize; one-third mile professional handicap, three prizes; one-fourth mile division championship (medal); one-mile professional handi-cap, three prizes; two-mile division cham-pionship (medal), pacemakers' prize; onethird mile professional obstacle race, three prizes riders must climb over the obstacles on the homestretch, mount their wheels, without assistance, and ride over the tape; one-mile amateur lap race, three prizes; two-mile protime trials (professional), flying start, paced, to establish track record, winner to receive a






