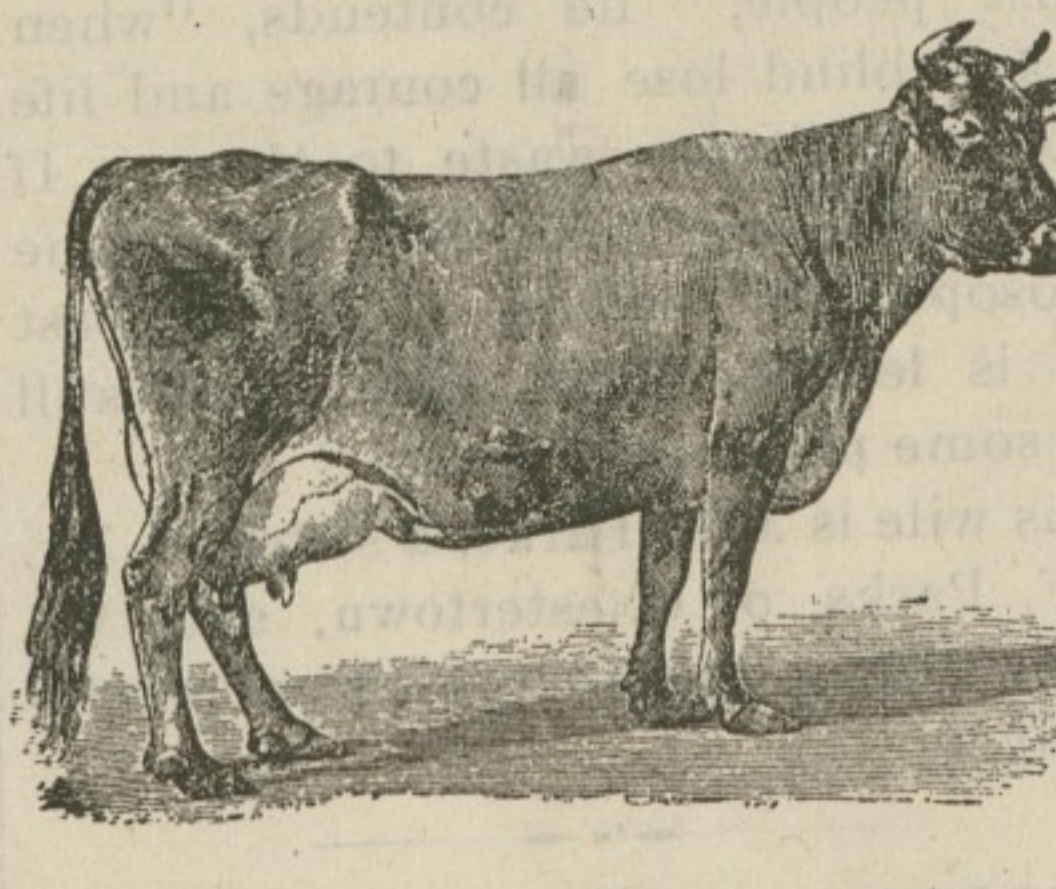

WHEAT THRESHING. Every Machine in Kent County Busy This Week—Poor Yields But Fine Condition—Scab Has Cut Crop.

Ideal weather for threshing has been experienced this week and every farmer who could make arrangements has been busy. The number of rigs in Kent county has more than doubled recently so that when the weather is favorable a half dozen farmers in the same neighborhood are busy threshing.

J. F. Walbert got 19 1/2 bushels per acre. W. G. Smyth got little over 20 bushels per acre. J. Kennard Aldridge got 19 bushels per acre.

J. T. DeCorse's crop averaged 15 bushels per acre. C. W. Harris got 32 bushels per acre off ten acres of tomato ground but averaged only 23 bushels off his whole acre.

Robert Kennedy averaged 13 bushels per acre. E. Jos. Watson averaged 15 bushels on the Skirven farm. Mrs. James L. Beck got about 13 bushels on her farm, near Tolchester.

Richard Bryan on the Beck farm got about ten bushels to the acre. Mr. W. E. Lond, near Fairlee, got 980 bushels from an acre of 50. Mr. Ivanhoe Willis on Mr. H. H. Klinefelter's farm on Chester river, in Queen Anne's, from 148 acres got 22 bushels per acre from his fallow land and 16 from corn land. He used Curt's Prolific wheat.

George Sutton threshed 1,000 bushels of wheat off 40 acres of fallow, near Locust Grove. R. Geesal on the Massey farm threshed about 10 bushels to the acre.

Fine Farm Sold.—Mr. W. M. Knight as agent of the heirs of the late Ex. Gov. James B. Groomer on last Saturday sold the "Moffett Farm" near Galena to Mr. Anthony H. Johnson, of the first district for \$12,000 cash. This is a fine farm.
