

## UNCERTAINTY OF POLITICS

The duplicity of Republican politicians and the uncertainty of Republican politics never had a more striking illustration than in the recent experience of Senator Joseph Benson Foraker, of Ohio. Three weeks ago Senator Foraker who for some time had been "off the reservation," because of his open opposition to the nomination of Mr. Taft for the Presidency, was welcomed back to the Republican camp amid great rejoicing of the faithful. Candidate Taft rushed out from his tepee to extend a cordial greeting to the returning prodigal and to assure him that there had never been any differences between them and that he would be, oh! so glad, to have his assistance in going out upon the war-path after the enemy.

At that time the word of Senator Foraker might have stood against the world of those who would say that there had ever been the slightest difference of policies, politics, or principles between himself and the Republican clearness standard bearer. Now, there is none so poor as to do him reverence. The President has virtually read him out of the Republican party, placed the brand of infamy upon him, and declared in terms which can not be misunderstood, that he shall not be permitted within the Republican fold to aid in the election of his personally selected and conducted candidate.

It was in Toledo no later than September 23 that the grand reunion of Taft and Foraker took place. Casting hook, bait, line and sinker overboard, Taft came in from his Middle Bass fishing camp to meet and confer with the Ohio Senator, his erstwhile opponent there to demonstrate to the whole country that they were in complete harmony and working as both expressed it, "shoulder to shoulder," for the success of the Republican cause. The formal meeting took place with elaborate stage setting before a large concourse of people. As the two men clasped hands in greeting there was a wild cheer from the crowd. When the curtain was rung down on this tableau there was a conference between Taft and Foraker which, according to newspaper reports, "lasted for more than an hour." Then followed a still more striking exhibition of the effort to show that all was peace and harmony, and that there never had been the slightest trouble. Taft and Foraker repaired to the Lyceum Opera House where a reception was held, and of course where a receipt on was he d, and, of course, the opportunity for speech-making could not be overlooked. President Puholland, of the Lincoln Club, under whose auspice the function was in progress, saw to that. Mr. Taft who sat beside Senator Foraker, was introduced and told what a pleasure it was for him to be there with Senator Foraker, "because," he said, "when Governor of Ohio, he gave me my first chance." Then he told what a further pleasure it was "to think in this presence that we are going to stand in the campaign shoulder to shoulder."

All the time while he was talking in the opportunity for speech-making could not be overlooked. President Puholland, of the Lincoln Club, under whose auspice the function was in progress, saw to that.
