FINE BUSINESS SOLD.

The J. K. Aldridge Hardware Store and Business Sold at Public Sale for \$21,550—Home Citizens, Purchasers.

The advertisement of the sale of the Hardware Store and Business of the late John K. Aldridge brought a large crowd to Chestertown Tuesday and the execution, Hope H. Barroll, Esq., made a prompt and advantageous sale. The purchasers of the whole plant, including store and stock of goods, tin shop and stable and lot on Cannon street were Messrs. George D. Lofland and William M. Culp at a bid of \$21,550. The lot on Cannon street brought \$550. Mr. George Bruce was a bidder up to \$18,500. The new owners took charge Tuesday with the efficient help of Messrs. William A. Wheatley and Chilton W. Wootch, who will continue to serve the patrons of this store.

Messrs. Lofland and Culp, the purchasers, are among Chestertown's best citizens, of high character and keen business acumen and it is a cause of congratulation that this business remains in the hands of home people. The new firm expect to devote their whole attention to the business after a few months but will retain their present positions for awhile.

The Sides store-room was held up at a bid of \$6,000 and may be bought at private sale. Mr. Aldridge bought all the property from Mr. Sparks for \$5,000.

STRAWBOARD MILL AFFAIR

A telegram from Newark, N. J., dated January 28th, says:
The reorganization of the United Boxboard and Paper Company, capitalized at \$28,000,000, which has been in receiver's hands since last July, is contemplated in an order obtained today by the stockholders from Vice-Chancellor Howell. The order calls on "whom it may concern" to appear on February 17 and show cause why the receivers, Thomas L. Raymond, of this city, and Sidney Mitchell, of Chicago, should not accept the offer of the United Boxboard Company, as the reorganization committee has been incorporated for the business. The reorganizers propose to pay the half million dollars indebtedness of the old company, assume all liabilities and the 17 large mills owned by the company and to issue to the stockholders of the old company shares for shares in the new company. The offer has the approval of 92 per cent. of the preferred stockholders and 84 per cent. of the common.

Some of the mills in the West have been started so that there is reason to believe that the mill at Chestertown will soon begin operations.
