The deceased was a native of Delaware but lived in this county for more than 57 years. Funeral services were held Monday conducted by Rev. T. H. Smith; interment in St. Pauls cemetery. The pall bearers were Messrs. R. L. Leaverton, William Ford, Tilden Brice, Oscar Faucett and Parnell Jefferson. Undertaker Charles L. Dodd had charge of arrangements.

**Mrs. GEORGE T. SEWELL.**  
Mrs. George T. Sewell, one of the best known and most beloved women of Rock Hall, died last Saturday afternoon at the home of her husband, after an illness of more than a year. **Self Defense.**—State's Attorney Albert Constable, of Cecil, states that four of the murder cases now on the docket in that county would be ready for trial in September, but that in the case of Eugene Emerson, colored, who fatally shot Clarence Rhodes, another negro, on the steamer "Annapolis" on August 7, he was of the opinion that the case would be disposed of before a magistrate and not go to the Grand Jury, as all the evidence pointed plainly to self-defense. Emerson having defended himself from attack.
