

GAME KILLED IN STATE

One million birds, rabbits and other species of game, valued at more than \$500.000. if all could have been placed upon the market were killed in Maryland during the hunting season of 1922, according to State Game Warden E. Lee Le Compte. The estimate was obtained by Mr. Le Compte by means of a question-

naire sent out to all persons who obtained hunting licenses last fall. There were 70,295 licenses issued. The answers to the questionnaire show the report that cottontail rabbits were scarce in Maryland last fall to be erroneous. According to Mr. Le Compte's estimate, 128,793 rab-bits were killed.






