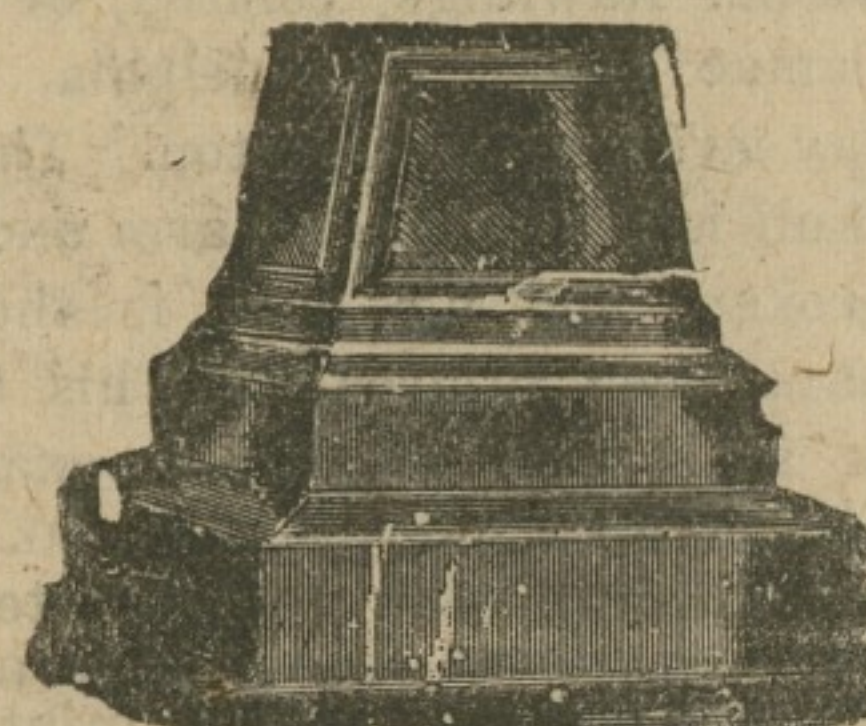

### PRIEST AND WOMAN KILLED IN CRASH

Two persons were instantly killed and another is dying in the Milford Hospital as the result of an accident at the boulevard crossing of the Maryland, Delaware and Virginia Railroad, near Haven Lake, early on Saturday afternoon.

The dead are the Rev. James C. Comiskey, pastor of Holy Cross Catholic Church at Dover, and Miss Priscilla Sharrod, the priest's housekeeper, Miss Burlington Connor, also of Dover, who fatally injured.

Both the priest and housekeeper were killed outright and their bodies mangled. Miss Connor, who was found to be still living, was identified by her keyring when she reached the hospital. She sustained internal injuries that surgeons say will result in death.

Father Comiskey was one of the best-beloved priests in the State. He was born in Ireland, but studied for the priesthood in this country. His first parish was at Centerville, Md., later being assigned to the Eastern diocese and afterward serving at St. Paul's Church in Wilmington before being assigned to Dover.

### HARFORD COW AT \$1,800

Mayflower's Fawn Face, a magnificent three year old Guernsey cow belonging to Hamilton Amoss, of Upper X Roads, topped the Merryman sale for females on Friday by selling at Timonium for \$1,800. Mr. Amoss sold another female for \$375 and one for \$340.

Thornton Kelly's smooth heifer, bought and developed under Calf Club supervision, created considerable comment and sold for \$510. Other club boys are now speculating on just how many dollars they own.

The whole eighty head offered were an outstanding lot well worth a trip of many miles to see, and it is small wonder an average price of \$510 was secured. Upland's Conqueror, a bull which cannot be faulted, topped the sale at \$4,000.

On the day preceding, the annual sale of Guernseys at Devon, Pa., resulted in 30 head being sold at an average of \$1,211. One bull sold for \$12,000, seven cows averaged \$5,000 and six bulls ranged from \$12,000 to \$7,000.

### GAME KILLED IN STATE

One million birds, rabbits and other species of game, valued at more than \$500,000, if all could have been placed upon the market were killed in Maryland during the hunting season of 1922, according to State Game Warden Lee Le Compte.

The estimate was obtained by Mr. Le Compte by means of a questionnaire sent out to all persons who obtained licenses last fall. There were 70,295 licenses issued.

The answers to the questionnaire show the report that cottontail rabbits were scarce in Maryland last fall to be erroneous. According to Mr. Le Compte's estimate, 128,793 rabbits were killed.

### TWO PLANS EVOLVED TO SAVE M. D. & V. RAILROAD

Two separate movements are under way to save the Maryland, Delaware and Virginia Railroad to the Eastern Shore, and to prevent scrapping of the road, as a result of its recent sale at public auction to E. B. Leaf & Co., Philadelphia. Adoption of either plan would insure continued operation of the road.

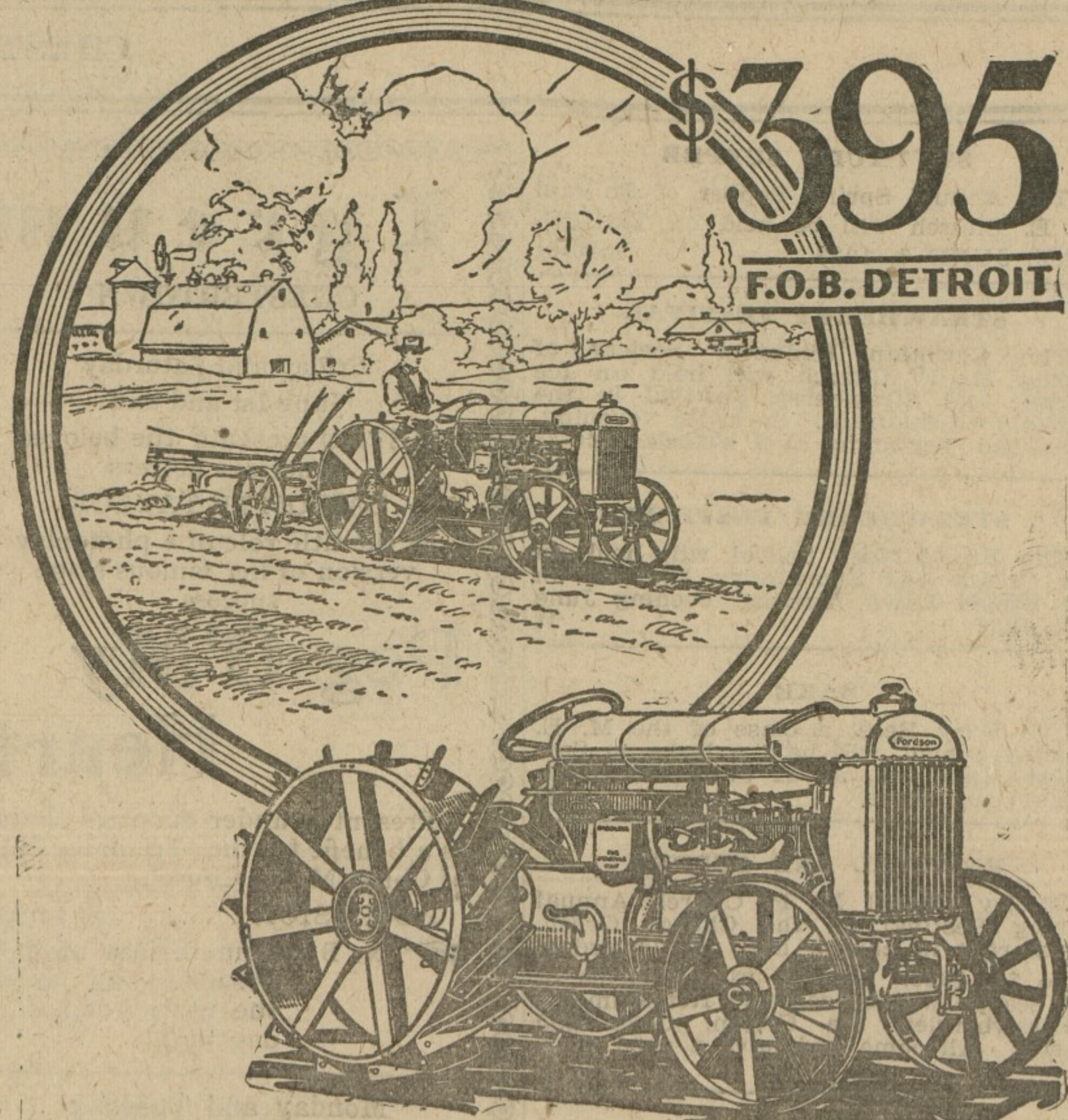
While a group of Baltimore business men are negotiating with the E. B. Leaf & Co. for outright purchase of the road, informal negotiations are under way between the Maryland Public Service Commission and the Pennsylvania Railroad looking toward re-purchase of the Maryland, Delaware and Virginia by the Pennsylvania, and its operation in connection with a fast ferry service between Baltimore and Love Point on the Eastern Shore.

The local group of business men is headed by Jesse Rosenfield, a member of the traffic department of the Merchants and Manufacturers' Association. Mr. Rosenfield and his associates will meet the Public Service Commission.

The members of the Public Service Commission feel that continued operation by the Pennsylvania offers the only hope for the future of the road.

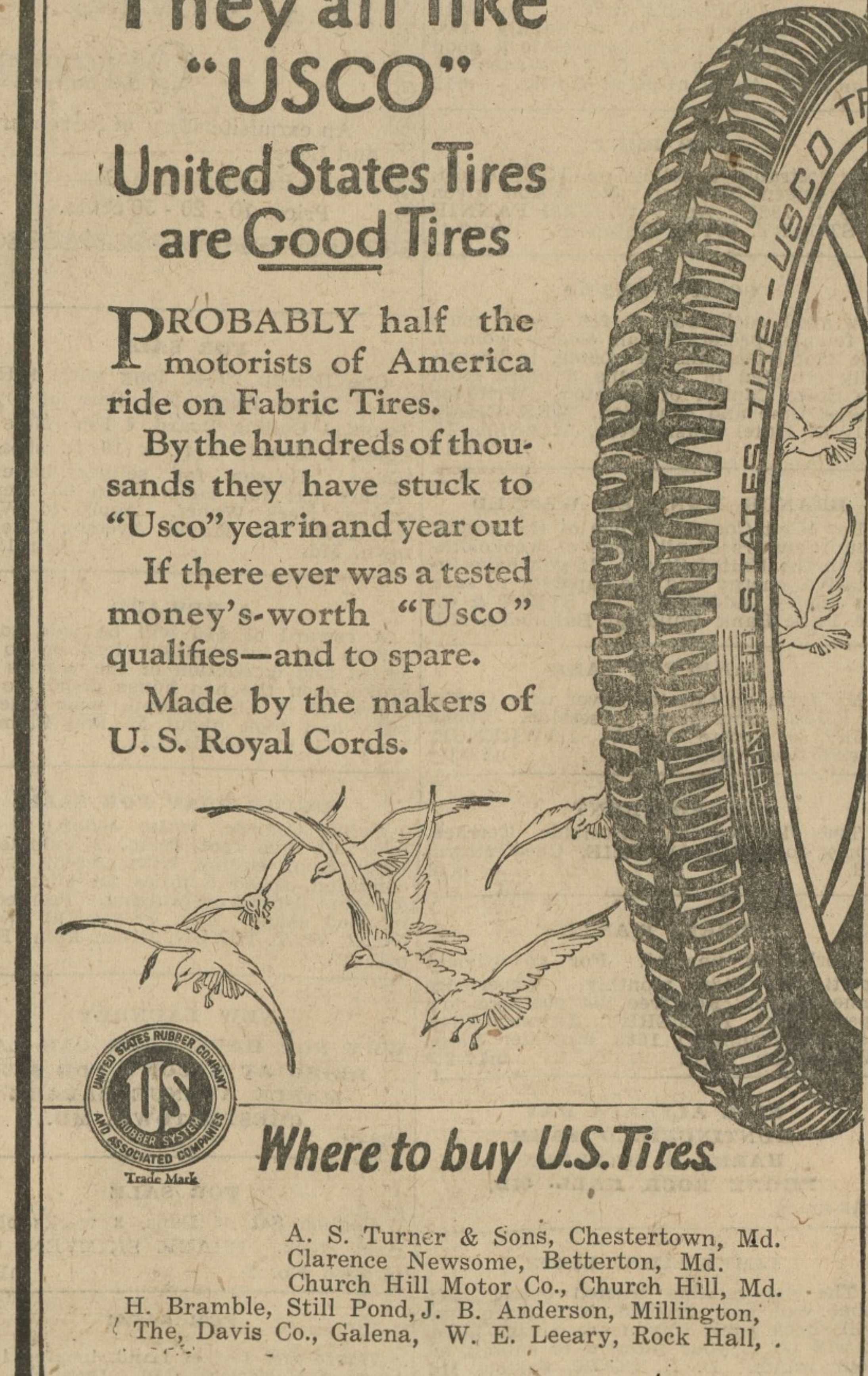

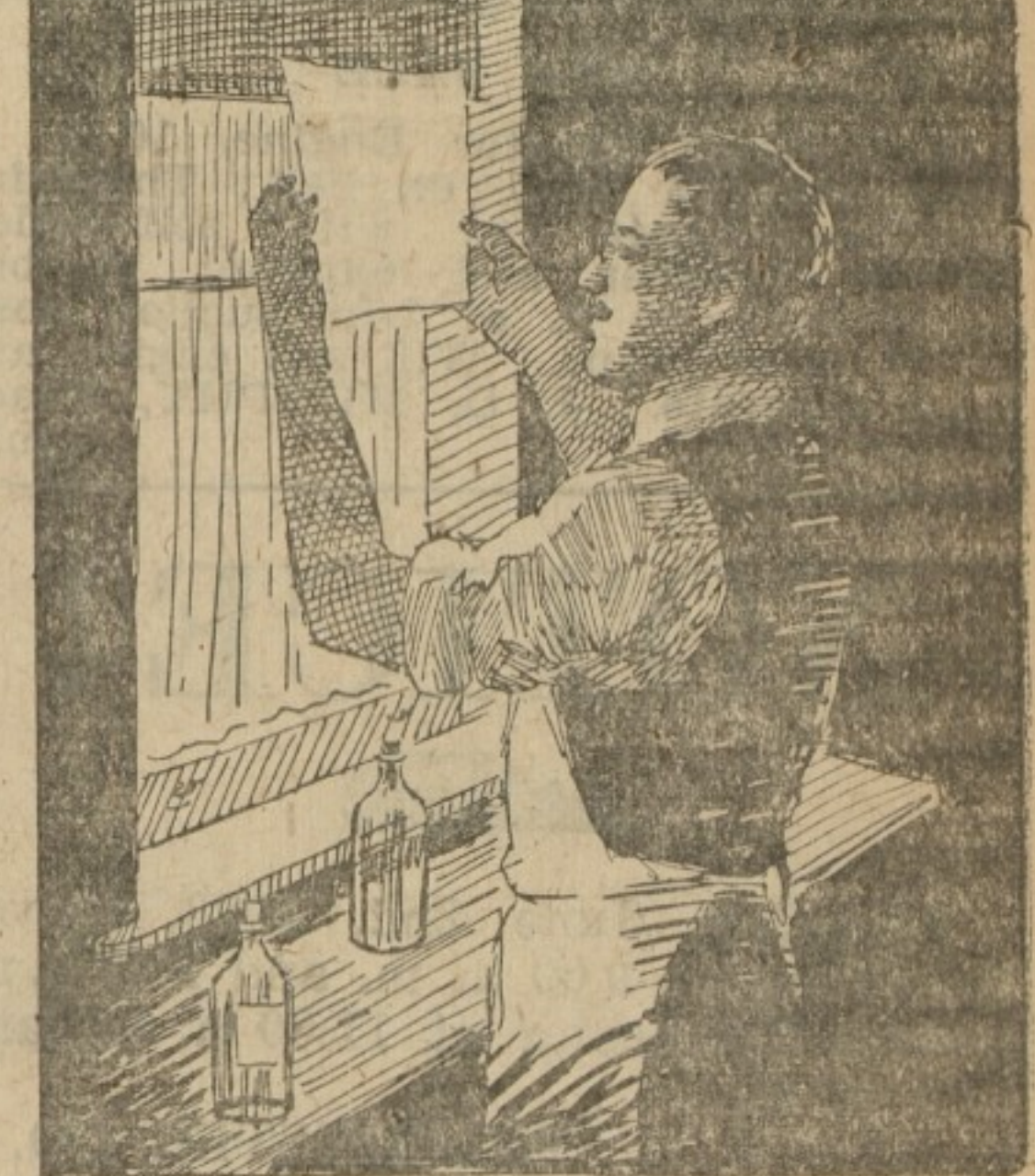
