Wm. Truitt Dies Four Days After His Young Daughter

Following closely his 8 year old daughter, Mary, in death, William Truitt of 223 Van Buren street, Wilmington, Saturday morning at 8:30 o'clock, succumbed, after a slow struggle for life, to injuries received on Sunday when the automobile which he was driving struck an abutment on the road and overturned, throwing the occupants to the ground. The accident occurred at Cayot's Corner, a short distance below Chesapeake City while enroute to Chestertown.

Unaware of the death of her husband and child, Mrs. Truitt lies in another section of Union Hospital, suffering from a severe injury to the head and bruises about the body. News of the death of her husband and little one have been closely guarded from her, as the sadness and shock would be too much for her weakened condition.

Turning his head to look at another motorist, who was stampering along the road near Cayot's Corner, Mr. Truitt's attention was diverted, and he was unable to heed the warning of his wife, "Look out, or we'll strike the bridge." The car crashed into the abutment and, witnesses say, turned completely over and crashed into a fence on the property of Thomas M. Price.

Mr. Truitt was 48 years old. His remains were brought to the home of his mother, Mrs. Laura Pleasanton on Sunday and funeral service was held from there on Monday afternoon at 2 p. m., conducted by Rev. N. O. Gibson.

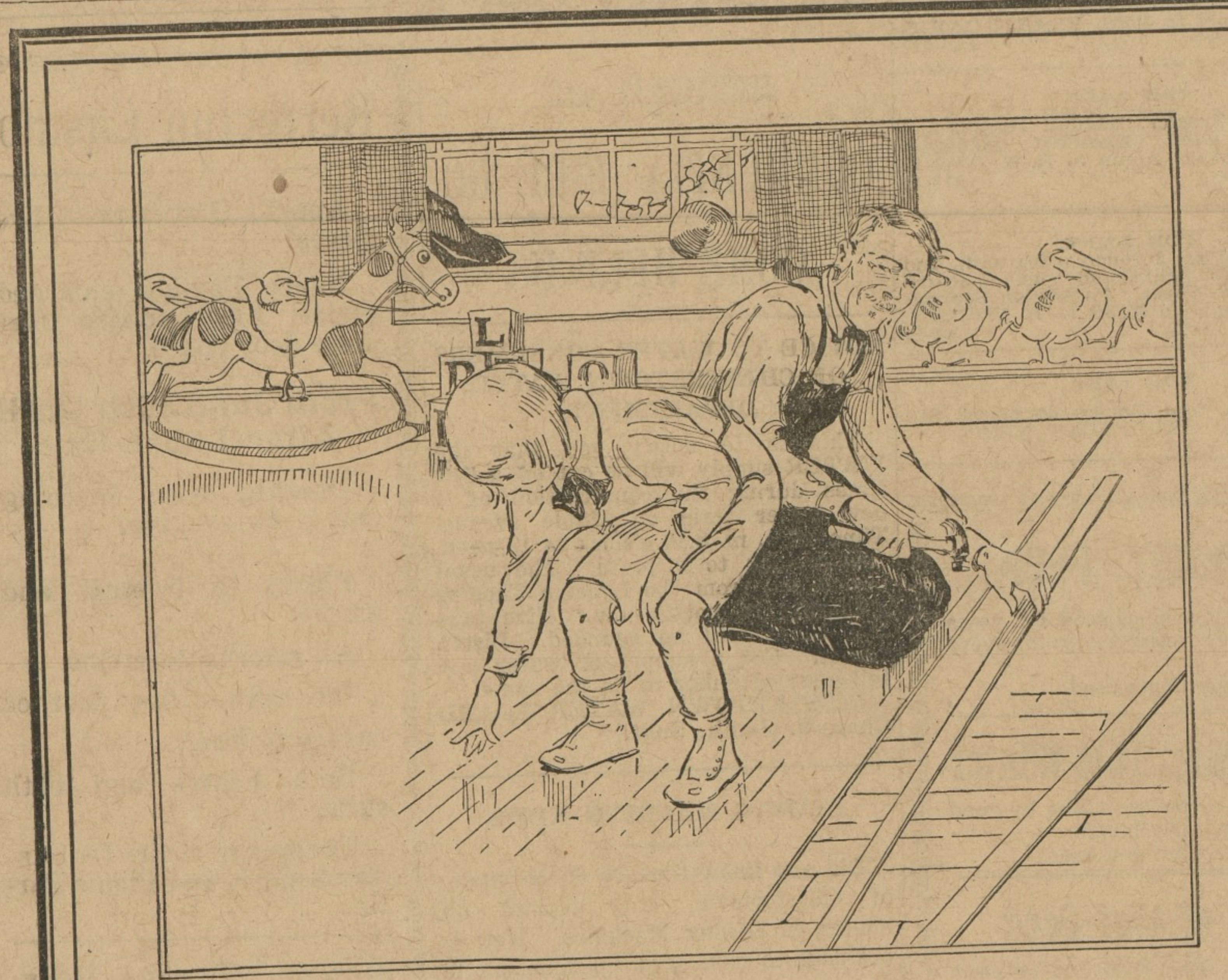
