There are around 5,000,000 pounds of storage turkeys, brought over from last year, according to a report of the United States Department of Agriculture. The report says: "This year's turkey crop is heavy, particularly in Texas, and turkeys are being raised in many new sections in Northern States. The birds have been bringing around 18 to 20 cents to Texas growers, and because of the size of the Texas crop State agricultural officials there are putting on campaigns for increased local consumption. Supplies in Maryland and Virginia are large.

"Heavy stocks of turkeys carried over from last year will be an important factor in the deal this year. Storage stocks are around 5,000,000 pounds, as compared with 2,000,000 pounds last year. Just what effect the existence of these storage stocks known. If prices are low enough to meet the average pocketbook, a heavy demand may be expected."
