Partridges Drowned.-Mr. Chas. W. Harris, a local oysterman, while in Reed's creek in a boat saw a covey of partridges fall in the creek and drown. Mr. Harris sailed to the spot where he saw them fall and picked up 33 birds. These birds were without a bruise and very fat. Partridges cannot fly very far and it is thought that they were chased by a hawk and became exhausted while, over the creek.

The Largest Canoe .- Capt. W. H. Haddaway, of Bayside, has just launched the largest canoe ever built here, the largest, in fact, ever seen in these waters. The boat is built of five logs, all worked out in different places, whereever a suitable tree could be found. When brought together they fitted with perfect accuracy. In boats of this structure the middle, or keelson log, is laid first and two logs are then built up on each side of it.

His First Ride on a Railroad Train. -Mr. John M. Wood, residing in Millington, Kent county, and 82 years old, took his first ride in a railroad coach Wednesday of this week. He came from Millington to Centreville on business. Mr. Wood is well-known in the upper part of Kent county where he has spent all of his long life. In 1865-66 he was engaged by the engineers to assist in making the survey of the railroad line from Masseys to Centreville and took his first ride on any railread this week .- Record.

Profitable Farming.—The most profitable tomato crop reported in Talbot county is that of Mr. Thos. Nossick, at Windy Hill, on the Choplank in Trappe district. His crop on 30 acres cleared him \$800, or \$26.663 an acre. This was on land that sold within the last ten years for \$10 an acre. The farming country about Windy Hill was sandy and sterile-almost barren-but industrious and intelligent cultivation has made it one of the best tomato, melon and potato-growing sections of the county. Mr. Nossick is a Bohemian who immigrated to this country a number of years ago and settled on the Choptank, first as a fisherman and trapper. Hard work and proper economy have made him an effluent citizen.




