In an instant we feel the vessel topple, as it were, over the summit of the avalanche with a plunge, and then rights herself on the placid bosom of the now tranquil river, one mile above the Rapids, and seven miles from Montreal. Vessells find it impossibe to get up the rapids, therefore the Lachine Canal had to be built. It is 8½ miles long and overcomes a rise of 45 feet. It has five locks 270 feet long and 45 feet wide and vessels drawing 12 feet can pass through it. It was built in 1812.

We pass under the big iron bridge of the Canadian Pacific and are impressed with its beauty, being constructed on the cantilever principle.

Next comes the Victoria Jubilee bridge one of the great engineering feats of the age. It is said to be the longest bridge in the world, two miles, cost \$6,000,000 and belongs to the Grand Trunk R. R., requiring six years to build it. The current runs at the rate of seven miles an hour and the ice jams about the big abutments in a threatening manner.




