

The Democratic mass meeting at Rock Hall Saturday night was a grand success. Elmer E. Leary, Esq., presided over the meeting and speeches were delivered by | * Hon. James E. Ellegood and Marion * deK. Smith, Esq. Mr. Ellegood said:

"The Baltimore Sun has called the campaign issue in this Congressional district the Eastern Shore issue, which after the manner of the lawyer, may be |* entitled Manhood ys. Money, or the People against Corrupt Wealth. This question of the corruption of the electorate we do not admit is peculiar to the Eastern Shore. While bribery has not permeated the whole country, it must be conceded that it prevails in many |* places to such an extent that even United States Senators have been ac- |* cused of buying their way through the Legislative Assemblies. That the issue in this campaign is confined to the Eastern Shore may be true, since the Democratic party has brought itself to |* the moral plane of making it an issue by nominating a candidate on the antibribery platform. The law relating to this issue is found in both the constitution and the statute, the penalty in the constitution being disqualification to hold office and disfranchisement forever, and the statutory penalty being fine and imprisonment. We therefore find that it is very heinous, dangerous in its consequences to the individual bribe-giver, and more so to the community, in that it destroys a fundamental doctrine of our Declaration of Independence—political equality, one man and one vote—for by so many votes as any candidate is able to buy has he multiplied his political power over that of a candidate who will not or cannot indulge in the corrupt practice. That the Republican candidate has put himself in the attitude of being an apologist of bribery and its promoter,

and indirectly putting his party in the same position, is unquestionably true. He has done so in direct violation of a promise on his part to cooperate with the Democratic candidate in the suppression of bribery and in making this a clean campaign and fair election for all the candidates in the field, and the only reason he now assigns for this SECURED position is that the Democratic party has been guilty of bribery in the past and he can't trust it for the future, though by the very cartoons in the Republican press it is admitted that the Democratic bribery "barrel" is empty, and that the party and its candidate are making a virtue of necessity, leaving him without the excuse or plea of necessity of having to "fight the devil with fire," as

it is usually called."
