In 1896 Dr. Price was presented with a pair of young wild geese from the famous wild goose farm on Chincoteague Island, Va. He gave his strange pets the best of attention and care, with the result that they thrived and became very tame for birds of their nature. It is very lively and eats the grass upon which it is fed very readily.
