

But while the British imported 3,530,659 hundredweights of mutton in 1904, the American farmer supplied only 7,420 hundredweights of this vast amount. Great Britain imported 314,468,106 pounds of wool last year, but bought only 1,086,650 pounds from the American farmer. It may thus be seen what an immense field of trade, even with one nation alone, is open to American enterprise in a single agricultural product.
