





The attention of all persons is particularly called to the following sections of Article 35. Code of Public Laws of Maryland SECTIO 145.—No person shall make any bet or wager on the result of any election to take place in this State. SECTION 48,—Any person offending against the last preceding section shall be liable to indictment to the Circuit Court, if the oftense be committed in any county, or in the Criminal Court of Baltimere if the offense be the use of the School Fund. part of the State as a wrger or bet upon elec
