





In a Delaware paper we find the followling: "With both Lewes and Milford having new postoffices built by the Government, Georgetown will endeavor to have this Coogress grant an appropriation for a federal building."

"After the hearing was over Loeb's wife, a bride of only a few months, appeared at the City Hall and talked with her husband. She engaged counsel to arrange for bail, and it was said that the case will be amicably adjusted. The contention is made that a mistake has been made in the arrest of Loeb.

"Loeb was arrested last night at his home by Thomas Kennan, an acting detective, on information furnished by Andrew Medders, sheriff of Chestertown, King, Heavy Short Boots, h who called at the Detective Bureau yes-According to Mr. Gray he only knew

the defendant slightly, having met him in the summer at a hotel in Chestertown. It is alleged by the police that Loeb was recently arrested in Chestertown and on has bail. Following the glving of the bail, it is alleged, that the defendant, in order to satisfy his bondsman, gave the latter a note for \$200.
