

Interest in the forty-third annual con-ention of the Protestant Episcopal June, is great, and arrangements for the entertainment of the delegates are now about completed. One gratifying feature of this part of the arrangements is that members of all denominations have come forward and asked the privilege of assisting in the entertainment of

The convention will open on Tuesday, June 6, after morning prayer and sermon at 9.30. The convention sermon will be preached by the Rev. Walter B. Stehl, rector of St. Paul's Parish, Centreville, one of the most eloquent preachers in the diocese. Immediately after organization the bishop will appoint the convention committees and the business of the meeting will begin.

The officers of the diocese are: Bishop Adams, president; secretary, Rev. E.R. Rich; assistant secretary, Rev. W. N. Weir, of Kent Island; chancellor, Hon. James Alfred Pearce, Chestertown; registrar, Rev. Henry Davies, Easton; treasurer of conventiou. Hon. William mission board, Col. Henry Hollyday,
Jr., Easton; treasurer diocesan clergy

Among the committees to report are the Board of Missions, composed of Mr. William Reddie, Col. Henry Hollyday, Jr., Rev. T. B. Barlow, of Cambridge: F. Kirk, St. Michaels; Rev. W. N. Weir, Stevensville. This committee disburses (1) annually nearly \$4,000.

On Episcopal Residence, composed of \* Mr. L. W. Trail, Mr. Francis G. Wrightson, and Mr. T. Hughlett Henry.

E. B. Hardcastle, Hon. J. Harry Cov-T. Rathell. This committee manages a fund of nearly \$45,000.

On Trust Funds of the Diocese, com posed of Rev. W. Y. Beaven, Mr. John H. Holt, Mr. Alexander Fountain, and Hon. Wm. H. Adkins. Over \$3,600 is disbursed annually by this committee. On Diocesan Clergy relief, composed \*
of Rev. Henry Davies, Mr. E. B. Hardcastle, Mr. T. Hughlett Henry, and Mr. Shannahan. \$3,000 per year is paid out W by this committee. This convention will be called upon to

finally settle several long-standing questions, among which are the proposed merging of the diocesan clergy relief \* fund of nearly \$15,000 with the general fund and the proposed division of North parish out of it, to be called Susquehanna Parish. Several important alternations in the church canons will be 1) also taken up.

The Diocese of Easton, embracing the entire Eastern Shore, has about 10,000 |? parishoners, 38 parishes with a property value of \$500,000. The total contributlions during the past year will probably Wexceed \$50,000.


