The bombardment, which began on Tuesday at daylight, was kept up during the day. The destruction of the magazine of Moultrie is represented as terrific. Though the facts are not positively known, there is no doubt in the minds of persons who witcessed the explosion, that even if 65 the magazine was not the main one 60 of the fort, which is by no means clear, the havoc created inside was such as to materially lessen its capacity for resistance. That this explosion, 18, in no small degree, owing to the fact that the monitor Weebawken grounded in front of Moultrie, is stated on the authority of an eye witness of the entire proceedings. The vessel could not move; she was
