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REPORT

OF THE SCHOOL COMMISSIONERS OF Q. A. CO.

CENTREVILLE, May 8th, 1860.

To the Honorable the Orphans Court of Queen Ann's County:

THE Commissioners of Primary Schools of Queen Ann's County, in accordance with an Act of the Legislature of Maryland passed March 1st 1850, chapter 269, respectfully present to your Honorable Body, through their President and Secretary, the annual report of their proceedings, setting forth in particular, the amount received and disbursed by them the past year, for the use of Primary Schools in said county.

There are in the county thirty eight school districts, in thirty seven of which school has been taught the whole year; the 38th district being a new district formed last year—a teacher was not employed until July.

The average number of pupils in attendance is 880.

The amount allowed for teachers' salary of each of the districts is \$300.

The receipts of the Board, and disbursements by them as appears from the statement made out by our Treasurer, and which has been examined by us are as follows:
