

if these letters were shown to me I would not say it was intended to be on a dispirited hand - I can't say they fall like letters in the hand of a dispirited man

I should say that the other letters are in Dr W's writing.

More of the Ciber is in his natural ordinary hand writing,

- the small 'y' turns over to the left  
some use only the right. Look to it -

I don't pretend to be able to say that a hand is genuine without comparison with other hands.

- The Darty letter of pen<sup>c</sup> appearance is not that of Dr W's writing. The 'y' - 't' - 'o' - 'w' -

'ai' this is more than, certainly done after the writing - so even here to be sure - 'w' 's'

This letter is an unnatural hand - I judge this to be dispirited & that this is Dr W's from the particular letters -

- The steel letter of Howard's has many things to writing at all, - words I judge by - on - or forms - was - his - w. - if - in - the - Boston but -

A letter also written with steel would be made to resemble writing of other hands in some way,

My own opinion is positive for where I have seen that this is Dr W's writing.
