

2. All the facts should be strictly consistent with the hypothesis. § 504

3. The circumstances should be of a conclusive nature & tendency. § 505

Such evidence is always insufficient when appearing all to be proved, while the evidence tends to prove, some other hypothesis may still be true. § 506

4. The circumstances should, to a moral certainty, actually exclude every other hypothesis but the one proposed to be proved. § 510.

Still danger remains of applying all these rules, requiring the utmost possible caution.
