

### 3. The technical defence —

Whenever the crime was shown the Jury committed, the Govt can win upon this great conviction line by proving that the crime was committed as charged in law on a basis of the facts.

This involves arguing as to rules of law upon this subject.

It is especially necessary to set forth particularly the manner of the death & the means by which it was effected — and a wound in some cases will be fatal.

Therefore to meet the proof which may come out on trial the Govt may set out the offense in many different ways, or many as they please — but the evidence must support them on a basis of law cases.
