In reply to the letter of Dr. Blake, Commissioner of Health, dated April 30th, in which he desires to be advised how to proceed in the following case, I beg to say:

The Commissioner gave a notice to make a sewerage connection at 2871 W. Lafayette avenue and he has been requested to extend the time, inasmuch as this property is now being administered in the Orphans' Court. If the Commissioner should find an extension of time was not justifiable in a case of this character, he should proceed to serve the notice upon the tenant or resident of said building, and also to attach a copy of the notice to said building, and if the same is not complied with, then to have the connection made according to the instructions the Health Department has heretofore received from this office. If there is no tenant or resident on said property the notice should be attached to said property.
