In re: COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT WATER BILLS IN NEW ANNEX

Dear Sir:

Replying to your letter of the 4th instant, in the matter of turning off water supply, in order to enforce payment of back water bills in the territory annexed to Baltimore City, by the Annexation Act of 1918, I beg to advise you as follows:

- 1. To enforce payment of water bills in arrears, the City has the right to turn off the water supply from the property of the water user so in arrears, provided, said bills accrued after the City took possession of the water plant supplying the property in question.
- 2. The City also has the right to turn off the water supply to enforce collection of water bills that are in arrears which accrued prior to the time the City took possession of the water plant supplying the property in question, provided, the water user whose supply

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
