soon as the weather turns warm the people cease to buy, consequently, we are only in the market at the most six months out of the year. We start not earlier than the middle of October and close around the first week in April.

Secondly, by the new law we are not permitted to kill our own hogs and as a consequence, buy Government Inspected hogs from Corkran, Hill & Co., Inc. This being the case, I cannot see why we should pay the above amount when the Government has already approved the goods. Meeting the Government requirements, I presume, certainly comes within the requirements of your bill.

I will appreciate your taking this up with your Law Department and see if this \$100. tax cannot be reduced.

Dear Sir:

In your letter requesting my opinion on the question of whether or not in Calendar No. 191-29 the applicant has a valid outstanding permit which may be exercised, you have stated the facts quite fully, and, as noted in your letter of inquiry, the papers pertaining to the matter were enclosed with said letter for my guidance.

The facts set out in your letter present a somewhat complicated situation and the specific questions which you ask are somewhat
