Gentlemen:

The enclosed letter from Mr. George Arnold Frick was referred to me for report. This letter requests the Board to consider the claim of Miss Ruth Smart for personal injuries received at the Baltimore City Hospitals where she was a student nurse.

As stated by Mr. Frick, the City is under no liability, under the Workmen's Compensation law nor in a civil action, for negligence in this matter.

There is no established rule or precedent for action by the Board of Estimates in such cases. As there is no legal question involved and no established precedent for action by the Board, there is no room for recommendation by me, and the Board must dispose of the matter in its own discretion.
