Reference is made to your letter of October 3, 1940, enclosing copy of a letter from Mr. Thomas P. Kenney, 16 St. Paul Street, requesting information as to obtaining a permit to transport sulphuric acid through Baltimore City in a tank trailer.

I understand that sulphuric acid is not an explosive material or compound and an examination of the Baltimore City Code discloses no ordinance which would require a permit for the transportation of sulphuric acid through the streets of Baltimore; nor do I find any ordinance which would regulate such transportation.

Should you deem it expedient to have such an ordinance prepared and submitted to the City Council, kindly so advise me.
